1 WHEREAS, The city of Houston lost an admired business and 2 civic leader on September 27, 2012, when Lloyd McReynolds passed 3 away at the age of 85; and

WHEREAS, A fourth-generation Houstonian, "Bland" McReynolds 4 5 was born on August 18, 1927, to Lloyd and Hazel McReynolds; he overcame polio as a young child and was playing on a basketball team 6 7 by the time he was a teenager; he later helped lead a local Sea Scout troop and participated in civil defense exercises; in 1946, he 8 graduated from The Kinkaid School, and in 1950, he earned a 9 bachelor's degree from Southern Methodist University, where he was 10 11 a member of Alpha Tau Omega fraternity; and

12 WHEREAS, After college, Mr. McReynolds returned to Houston to work for the family business, Universal Printing, for several 13 14 years, before selling it to begin what would become a long and successful career in real estate and investment; a prominent figure 15 16 in his professional community, Mr. McReynolds helped organize the Houston Apartment Association, served as the first president of the 17 Texas Apartment Association, and cofounded Pan American Land 18 Company; moreover, he established and owned Bland McReynolds 19 20 Interests and River Oaks Commercial Corporation and was the general 21 partner of West Belt Crossing; and

22 WHEREAS, Civically engaged, Mr. McReynolds served as chair of 23 the Houston City Planning Commission, president of the Zoological 24 Society of Houston, and director of Civil Defense under three

mayors; he was also active with local causes supporting property 1 rights and taxpayer interests, and he was part of the Houston host 2 3 committee to re-elect President Gerald Ford; in addition, he was a director and chair of the board of Union Bank of Houston, and served 4 5 as a director of numerous other financial institutions in the area; in addition, Mr. McReynolds was director and president of the River 6 Oaks Property Owners Association and a cofounder and director of 7 8 the National Foundation for Ileitis and Colitis; and

9 WHEREAS, This esteemed Texan married LaNelle Ueckert in 1959 10 and they became the parents of three children, Melanie, John, and 11 Joseph; at the age of 70, he married the former Judy Baumann and 12 they shared 15 rewarding years together; and

WHEREAS, Mr. McReynolds was a member of the Navy League of the 13 14 United States and a colonel in the Commemorative Air Force, and in 15 his leisure time, he loved flying friends and family around in his prized PA 31P Navajo airplane; an avid outdoorsman, he enjoyed 16 17 skeet shooting and bird hunting, and he also took great pleasure in boating with family and friends on Lake McQueeney; he was a member 18 19 of River Oaks Country Club, the Coronado Club, the Key Club, Lake Breeze Ski Lodge, and the Greater Houston Gun Club; and 20

21 WHEREAS, Friendly and outgoing, Bland McReynolds made a 22 positive difference in countless lives through his dedication to 23 the city he was proud to call home, and he will be remembered with 24 great admiration by all those who had the good fortune to know him; 25 now, therefore, be it

26 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 83rd Texas 27 Legislature hereby pay tribute to the memory of Lloyd "Bland"
