WHEREAS, The daughter of Eugene Powell Willard and Dorothy 4 5 Neal Willard, Vickie Willard was born on September 6, 1951, in San Antonio; she graduated from Douglas MacArthur High School and 6 7 earned a degree in education from Southwest Texas State University in San Marcos, where she was a member of the Chi Omega fraternity; 8 9 moreover, she was on the college dance team, the Southwest Texas Strutters, and she continued to support the group throughout her 10 11 life; and

12 WHEREAS, She married James Wayne Patterson, and their years 13 of devoted matrimony were further enriched by the addition of a 14 daughter, Jayme, and a son, James; the couple raised their children 15 in Houston and later moved to a ranch in Gonzales County; and
