1           WHEREAS, Students in the Teen Leadership Class at Pilot Point  
2 Middle School were selected to participate in an innovative  
3 initiative called the Rain Barrel Project; and

4           WHEREAS, Organized by City Secretary Alice Holloway and  
5 members of Keep Pilot Point Beautiful, the project was supported by  
6 a Green Bag Grant from Keep Texas Beautiful and H-E-B/Central  
7 Market, which Ms. Holloway used to purchase seven rain barrels; and

8           WHEREAS, Teen Leadership teacher Kelly Erwin focused several  
9 lessons on the importance of reducing runoff and conserving water  
10 and on how rain barrels are an important tool in that effort;  
11 students subsequently had the opportunity to decorate each of the  
12 rain barrels, and they hope to be involved in placing them at  
13 strategic locations around the campus; and

15 most precious resources, these dedicated students are setting an  
16 outstanding example for their peers, their families, and their
