WHEREAS, Dr. Michael D. McFarland, who became superintendent of the district in May 2010, ably guides a staff of accomplished administrators, teachers, and support personnel, all of whom are committed to providing an outstanding education to area young people; in recent years, Lancaster ISD has made remarkable progress in closing achievement gaps, with pronounced improvements in such areas as test performance and college and career readiness; and

WHEREAS, Based on data from 2011, the Texas Education Agency

awarded the district 20 Gold Performance Acknowledgements, the most in the district's history, and assigned the "recognized" rating to six campuses, marking another district record; the following year, Lancaster ISD achieved membership in the Texas High Performing School Consortium, becoming one of only 22 districts to earn that honor, and received an Award of Distinction from the National Institute for Excellence in Teaching; several campuses have
