

R E S O L U T I O N

1 WHEREAS, The certain knowledge of a life well lived may
2 temper the profound sadness that the death of Mike Moses Anzaldua,
3 Jr., on December 21, 2012, has brought to all who loved him; and

4 WHEREAS, The son of Mike and Maria Anzaldua, Mr. Anzaldua was
5 born on November 26, 1944; he grew up in Robstown and was an honor
6 roll student and all-state musician at Robstown High School; he
7 went on to earn degrees from Del Mar College and East Texas State
8 University; and

9 WHEREAS, Returning to Del Mar as an English professor in
10 1969, Mr. Anzaldua went on to build a notable career in higher
11 education that spanned more than four decades; he served as chair of
12 the Department of English and Philosophy and interim dean of Arts
13 and Sciences, and he helped lead such innovations as the College
14 Development Education Council, the Mariachi Del Mar musical
15 initiative, and the Mexican American Studies program; and

16 WHEREAS, Mr. Anzaldua also contributed to Del Mar College as
17 a tenured member of the Faculty Council, as assistant director of
18 the East Campus Writing Center, and as director of the Title V
19 Learning Communities Program; in addition, he was instrumental in
20 the institution's reaffirmation of accreditation with the Southern
21 Association of Colleges and Schools; and

22 WHEREAS, Off campus, Mr. Anzaldua gave back to his profession
23 as an officer in several national education organizations,
24 including the Texas Association of Chicanos in Higher Education; he
25 earned many prestigious honors for his exceptional work through the

1 years, among them the Dr. Aileen Creighton Award for Teaching
2 Excellence, the Labor Council for Latin American Advancement
3 Teaching Award, the Spanish Language Institute Outstanding
4 Lecturer Medallion, and the National Institute for Staff and
5 Organizational Development Excellence in Teaching Award; at the
6 time of his death, he was professor emeritus of English; and

7 WHEREAS, This esteemed Texan was involved in the greater
8 community as a longtime church choir director, and in his leisure
9 time he enjoyed discussing literature, going to the movies, and
10 sharing a meal with friends and loved ones; and

11 WHEREAS, Although Mike Anzaldua is deeply missed, memories of
12 his warmth, unfailing generosity, and passion for education remain
13 to comfort and inspire those he leaves behind; now, therefore, be it

14 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 83rd Texas
15 Legislature hereby pay tribute to the life of Mike Moses Anzaldua,
16 Jr., and extend sincere condolences to the members of his family: to
17 his sister, Della Pierce, and her husband, Jim; to his brother, Jack
18 Anzaldua, and his wife, Alma; to his nephews, Christopher Anzaldua
19 and his wife, Karla, Stephen Anzaldua and his wife, Amanda, Paul
20 Anzaldua and his wife, Alisha, David Pierce and his wife, Jessica,
21 and Dr. Jeffrey Pierce; to his grandniece, Ana Teresa Anzaldua; and
22 to his other relatives and friends; and, be it further
