1           WHEREAS, Friends and family are mourning the loss of U.S. Air  
2 Force Lieutenant Colonel (Ret.) Albert Coolley Lloyd, Jr., of  
3 Austin, who passed away on March 18, 2012, at the age of 74; and

4           WHEREAS, Born on May 17, 1937, Al Lloyd began his military  
5 career in 1956 when he enlisted in the U.S. Air Force; he  
6 subsequently served in the Texas Air National Guard from 1961 to  
7 1995; Colonel Lloyd completed 33 enlisted and officer courses and  
8 received 27 federal and state medals and decorations; and

9           WHEREAS, Over the course of nearly four decades of service to  
10 his country, Colonel Lloyd developed an unmatched knowledge of  
11 military administrative policy and personnel and computer systems;  
12 he created an advanced personnel data program that had a major  
13 impact on all branches of the armed forces in Texas, and he oversaw  
14 an awards program for Air National Guard judge advocates and  
15 paralegals; for 18 years, he held the position of director of  
16 military personnel and data systems with the adjutant general's  
17 department; moreover, he served as clerk to the Texas Court of  
18 Military Appeals; and

19           WHEREAS, After retiring, Colonel Lloyd volunteered at the  
20 Texas Military Forces Museum, cataloguing a vast amount of  
21 historical material, and served as president of the Texas Military  
22 Forces Historical Foundation; and

23           WHEREAS, In all of his endeavors, Colonel Lloyd enjoyed the  
24 love and support of his wife of 32 years, Bertha Lloyd, and he took

1 pride in a fine family that included two daughters, Deana and  
2 Roberta, five grandchildren, Morgan, Monica, Lawrence, Moriah, and  
3 Jared, and several great-grandchildren; he also delighted in time  
4 spent with his prized Yorkshire terriers, Sir Kahlua, Mia Kaye, and  
5 Ira Panzer; and

6 WHEREAS, Colonel Lloyd left a lasting imprint on the Texas  
7 Air National Guard and the Texas military community through his  
8 professional achievements, and his exceptional contributions will  
9 continue to resonate in the Lone Star State and beyond; now,  
10 therefore, be it

11 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 83rd Texas  
12 Legislature hereby pay tribute to the life of U.S. Air Force  
13 Lieutenant Colonel (Ret.) Albert Coolley Lloyd, Jr., and extend
