R E S O L U T I O N

1           WHEREAS, The observance of Texas Federation for Republican  
2 Outreach Legislative Day at the State Capitol on May 23, 2013,  
3 provides a fitting opportunity to recognize the notable service of  
4 Clyde Raymond Leuchtag as Republican Party precinct chair for  
5 Precinct 390 in Harris County; and

7 of Texas, the Texas Federation for Republican Outreach is an

19 general elections; these civic-minded individuals are integral to

21 build a better tomorrow; and

22           WHEREAS, Through their involvement, precinct chairs and  
23 captains are making a positive difference in their communities,  
24 this state, and the nation, and they may take justifiable pride in

1 their admirable record of civic engagement; now, therefore, be it

2       RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 83rd Texas  
3 Legislature hereby commend Clyde Raymond Leuchtag for serving as a  
4 Republican Party precinct chair and extend to this outstanding  
5 Texan sincere best wishes for the future; and, be it further
