1 WHEREAS, The observance of Texas Federation for Republican
2 Outreach Legislative Day at the State Capitol on May 23, 2013,
3 provides a fitting opportunity to recognize the notable service of
4 William Henry Dibrell of Katy as a former Republican Party precinct
5 chair; and

7 of Texas, the Texas Federation for Republican Outreach is an
