## RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, The vitality of the political process in Texas 2 depends on the active participation of its citizens, and Joyce 3 Dorrycott has demonstrated an exemplary spirit of civic engagement 4 in both her professional and volunteer endeavors; and

5 WHEREAS, Beginning her college career at the age of 40, Ms. 6 Dorrycott graduated from Southwest Texas State University with a 7 bachelor's degree in history and political science in 1974 and a 8 master's degree in 1976; and

9 WHEREAS, She worked for the Texas House of Representatives 10 for two sessions, then returned to Southwest Texas State University 11 as an instructor, teaching students about the role of government; 12 she briefly left the university to work as director of special 13 projects in the office of District Attorney Sam Millsap during the 14 1980s, advocating for measures related to child abuse and family 15 violence and helping to establish the family violence unit; and

WHEREAS, After retiring from teaching in 1994, Ms. Dorrycott 16 17 soon found a new challenge, participating in the Northwest Democrats and chairing the organization for eight years; she also 18 oversaw several political campaigns, has twice served on the 19 20 City/County Consolidation Commission, has been a member of the elections committee for Bexar County, and took part in Target '90, 21 22 the San Antonio community planning project led by then Mayor Henry Cisneros; furthermore, she has chaired three separate district 23 attorney task forces on juvenile justice, domestic violence, and 24 25 child abuse; additionally, she has found the time to write and is

1 the author of numerous articles and books; and

WHEREAS, This esteemed Texan has been honored for her work by 2 many organizations and committees, including the statewide Council 3 on Child Abuse and Neglect Prevention, the Children's Trust Fund of 4 5 San Antonio, the Bexar County Coalition on Domestic Violence, and the Commission on Juvenile Justice; she has been recognized with 6 the Lifetime Achievement Award from the Bexar County Democratic 7 8 Party, and in 1984, she was inducted into the San Antonio Women's Hall of Fame; and 9

WHEREAS, As an exceptional teacher, a strong voice in educating the public about domestic violence, and a respected political advisor, Joyce Dorrycott has worked tirelessly for good government, and she may indeed take pride in her notable achievements; now, therefore, be it
