## RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, Proud residents of Socorro celebrated the town's
165th anniversary at Fiesta del Valle held in May 2013; and

3 WHEREAS, After the Pueblo Revolt of 1680 in northern New Mexico, Spaniards and their Native American allies relocated to the 4 5 Socorro area, where they built the Nuestra Senora de la Limpia Concepcion del Socorro Mission; though the mission was destroyed 6 7 twice by the flooding of the Rio Grande, determined settlers built a third church in 1843, and it still stands today; in 1848, after the 8 9 Mexican-American War, the City of Socorro became an official Texas 10 municipality; and

11 WHEREAS, Socorro residents commemorated this anniversary 12 with the biggest fiesta in east El Paso County, an event that featured music, food, a dance competition, and the largest 13 14 fireworks display in the city's history; on the last night of the festival, Noche Mexicana, Socorro welcomed their featured guest, 15 Jacob Prado, the Consul General of Mexico in El Paso, as an 16 expression of the continuing friendship between the neighboring 17 18 countries; and

WHEREAS, Celebrating their rich history as they work to build a bright and prosperous future, the people of Socorro may indeed take great pride in the important role their city has played in the story of our state and nation; now, therefore, be it
