1 WHEREAS, The city of Quitman lost an admired public servant 2 with the passing of Mayor Jerry W. Edwards, Sr., on January 4, 2013, 3 at the age of 59; and

WHEREAS, Born in Alice on September 6, 1953, to Roy and Mary Lou Edwards, Jerry Edwards earned his bachelor's degree at East Texas State University and went on to pursue postgraduate studies in management; in 1982, he moved from Paris, Texas, to Quitman, where he soon became a prominent community leader; and

9 WHEREAS, First elected as an alderman on the Quitman City Council in 1984, Mr. Edwards was a member of city government for 10 11 more than 20 years, serving several terms as alderman and two years 12 as mayor pro tempore and holding the office of mayor in 1994 and from 2009 until the time of his death; this dedicated official 13 14 realized a range of important achievements and was particularly effective in increasing public involvement in city governance by 15 creating citizen advisory committees and a communications 16 committee to work with civic groups, churches, and residents; and 17

WHEREAS, Mayor Edwards was the executive director of the 18 Northeast Texas Child Advocacy Center for 13 years, devoting 19 20 himself to the organization's mission of preventing and 21 investigating child abuse and assisting its victims; in addition, he served as president of the Wood County Child Protection Board and 22 23 was a member of the executive directors committee of the Children's Advocacy Centers of Texas as well as two child fatality review 24

2 WHEREAS, This engaged citizen was the founding president of 3 the Quitman/Lake Fork Kiwanis Club and a member of the Quitman Independent School District Board of Trustees; moreover, he served 4 5 as president of the Wood County Central Hospital District board of directors for two terms and was active in the congregation at Sand 6 Springs Baptist Church in Mineola; over the years, Mayor Edwards 7 8 received a number of honors for his contributions, including the Quitman Chamber of Commerce Citizen of the Year award and the Wood 9 10 County Bar Association Liberty Bell Award; and

11 WHEREAS, In all his endeavors, Mayor Edwards enjoyed the love 12 and support of his wife, Laura, and he took great pride in his three 13 children, Jerry, Jim, and Jennifer, and his seven grandchildren; 14 and

WHEREAS, Through his enduring dedication to Quitman and its citizens and his passionate advocacy in behalf of young Texans, Jerry W. Edwards made a lasting and positive difference in the world around him, and he will long be remembered with great admiration and affection; now, therefore, be it
