RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, November 27, 2014, marks the annual celebration of

2 Thanksgiving, an occasion when Americans gather among loved ones

3 and recount the year's bounties and blessings; and

WHEREAS, Thanksgiving is among our oldest and most cherished

5 traditions, a holiday whose history intertwines closely with the

narrative of our nation and whose spirit of fellowship and goodwill

7 has endured through all times of triumph and uncertainty; and

8 WHEREAS, Its origins can be traced nearly four centuries ago

9 to the year 1620, when the Pilgrims made landfall on Plymouth Rock;

10 finding themselves inadequately prepared for the harsh New England

11 winter, they took refuge in prayer and were at last assisted by a

12 tribe of Native Americans, whose knowledge of the land helped them

13 to reap a plentiful harvest; the grateful settlers declared a

three-day feast to honor the kindness of their newfound friends and

15 to acknowledge the grace of God in seeing them through their time of

16 hardship; and

17 WHEREAS, Thanksgiving was first observed in the fledgling

18 United States in 1789, one year after the adoption of the

19 Constitution; during the inaugural session of Congress, a

20 resolution was put forth calling on President George Washington to

21 enact "a day of public thanksgiving" to God for allowing the

22 American people to establish a peaceful rule of government;

23 President Washington agreed, and in his first proclamation to the

24 nation, invited Americans to reflect on the gifts of tranquility,

- 1 unity, and prosperity bestowed on them; and
- 2 WHEREAS, It was decades later, when the fate of the union was
- 3 imperiled during the dark days of the Civil War, that President
- 4 Abraham Lincoln delivered his famous Thanksgiving Day proclamation
- 5 calling for "the Almighty hand" to heal and restore the nation;
- 6 since that time, a presidential Thanksgiving proclamation has been
- 7 issued by each of his successors over the past 150 years; and
- 8 WHEREAS, On this most American of holidays, individuals from
- 9 all walks of life cast aside troubles and disagreements to treasure
- 10 the comforts of hearth and kin; mindful of the freedom and security
- 11 that we continue to enjoy, Americans honor the service and
- 12 sacrifice of members of our armed forces and all those at home who
- 13 confront danger to ensure the safety of their communities; we
- 14 extend thanks to the many people who enrich our lives in ways great
- 15 and small, and we strive to share our abundance with fellow citizens
- 16 in need; and
- WHEREAS, Signifying the bonds of faith, friendship, and
- 18 family from which we have always drawn our deepest strength,
- 19 Thanksgiving is redolent of the brighter dawn that has always
- 20 awaited us, and it is a great pleasure to join with our countrymen
- 21 and countrywomen to reflect on this historic and joyous occasion;
- 22 now, therefore, be it
- 23 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 83rd Texas
- 24 Legislature hereby commemorate Thanksgiving 2014.
