Anderson suffered an immeasurable loss with the death of this 3 valiant soldier on February 22, 2012, at the age of 32; and WHEREAS, Assigned to the Marine Aviation Weapons and Tactics 4 5 Squadron One at Marine Corps Air Station Yuma, Major Anderson was tragically killed while conducting a nighttime training exercise at 6 7 the Yuma Training Range Complex near the Arizona-California border; 8 and 9 WHEREAS, Nathan Anderson graduated from Amarillo High School in 1998 and attended Texas A&M University on an ROTC scholarship; he 10 11 was a member of the Corps of Cadets Company H-1 and served as a Ross 12 Volunteer; he was commissioned a second lieutenant in the U.S. Marine Corps on December 20, 2002, and finished in the top 10 13 14 percent of his class at The Basic School in Quantico, Virginia; determined to become a pilot, he attended flight training in 15 16 Pensacola, Florida, and earned his wings on February 25, 2005; and WHEREAS, Major Anderson excelled as a Huey helicopter pilot 17 18 and was a natural leader who helped train and mentor others; after completing three tours of duty in support of Operation Iraqi 19 20 Freedom, he was invited to become an instructor pilot with the elite 21 Marine Aviation Weapons and Tactics Squadron One; his many decorations include an Individual Air Medal for heroism, Air Medal 22 23 with Strike/Flight (numeral 2), Navy and Marine Corps Commendation
