## RESOLUTION

BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the State of Texas, 83rd Legislature, Regular Session, 2013, That House Rule 13, Section 9(a), be suspended in part as provided by House Rule 13, Section 9(f), to enable the conference committee appointed to resolve the differences on Senate Bill 1158 (relating to higher education for veterans and their families) to consider and take action on the following matters:

8 (1) House Rule 13, Section 9(a)(4), is suspended to permit 9 the committee to add text on matters which are not included in 10 either the house or senate version of the bill in SECTION 1 of the 11 bill by amending Sections 54.341(d), (h), and (l), Education Code, 12 to read as follows:

The governing board of each institution of higher 13 (d) 14 education granting an exemption under this section shall require 15 each applicant claiming the exemption to submit to the institution, in the form and manner prescribed by the Texas Veterans Commission 16 for purposes of this section under Section 434.0079(b), Government 17 Code, an application for the exemption and <u>necessary</u> [satisfactory] 18 evidence that the applicant qualifies for the exemption not later 19 than the last class date of the semester or term to which the 20 21 exemption applies, except that the governing board may encourage the submission of an application and evidence by the official day of 22 record for the semester or term to which the exemption applies on 23 24 which the institution must determine the enrollment that is

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1 reported to the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board [one year
2 after the earlier of the date the institution:

3 [(1) provides written notice to the applicant of the 4 applicant's eligibility for the exemption; or

5 [(2) receives a written acknowledgement from the 6 applicant evidencing the applicant's awareness of the applicant's 7 eligibility for the exemption].

8 (h) The governing board of each institution of higher education shall electronically report to the Texas Veterans 9 10 <u>Commission</u> [Higher Education Coordinating Board] the information required by Section <u>434.00791</u>, <u>Government Code</u>, [<del>61.0516</del>] relating 11 to each individual receiving an exemption from fees and charges 12 under Subsection (a), (a-2), [<del>or</del>] (b), or (k). The institution 13 14 shall report the information not later than January 31 [December 15 31] of each year for the fall semester, June 30 [May 31] of each year for the spring semester, and September 30 of each year for the 16 17 summer session.

18 (1) To be eligible to receive an exemption under Subsection19 (k), the child must:

(1) be a student who is classified as a resident under
Subchapter B when the child enrolls in an institution of higher
education; [and]

(2) <u>as a graduate or undergraduate student, maintain a</u>
grade point average that satisfies the grade point average
requirement for making [make] satisfactory academic progress in a
degree, certificate, or continuing education program as determined
by the institution at which the child is enrolled in accordance with

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1 the <u>institution's</u> policy <u>regarding eligibility for</u> [<del>of the</del> 2 <u>institution's</u>] financial aid; and

3 (3) be 25 years of age or younger on the first day of 4 the semester or other academic term for which the exemption is 5 <u>claimed</u> [department, except that the institution may not require 6 the child to enroll in a minimum course load].

Explanation: These changes are necessary to clarify the
reporting and eligibility requirements for certain tuition
exemptions awarded to veterans and their families.

10 (2) House Rule 13, Section 9(a)(4), is suspended to permit 11 the committee to add text on a matter which is not included in 12 either the house or senate version of the bill in SECTION 2 of the 13 bill by adding Section 54.3411(e), Education Code, to read as 14 follows:

15 (e) The amount available for distribution from the fund may be appropriated only to offset the cost to institutions of higher 16 17 education of the exemptions required by Section 54.341(k). The amount appropriated shall be distributed to eligible institutions 18 in proportion to each institution's respective share of the 19 aggregate cost to all institutions of the exemptions required by 20 Section 54.341(k), as determined by the Legislative Budget Board. 21 The amount appropriated shall be distributed annually to each 22 eligible institution of higher education. 23

Explanation: This change is necessary to clarify the distribution of funds for certain tuition exemptions awarded to children of certain veterans.

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(3) House Rule 13, Section 9(a)(4), is suspended to permit

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1 the committee to add text on a matter which is not included in 2 either the house or senate version of the bill in SECTION 3 of the 3 bill by adding Section 434.0079(c), Government Code, to read as 4 follows:

5 <u>(c) The commission shall adopt rules governing the</u> 6 <u>coordination of federal and state benefits of a person eligible to</u> 7 <u>receive an exemption under Section 54.341(k), Education Code,</u> 8 <u>including rules governing:</u>

9 <u>(1) the total number of credit hours assigned under</u> 10 <u>that section that a person may apply to an individual degree or</u> 11 <u>certificate program, consistent with the standards of the</u> 12 <u>appropriate recognized regional accrediting agency; and</u>

13 (2) the application of the assigned exemption to 14 credit hours for which the institution of higher education does not 15 receive state funding.

Explanation: This change is necessary to require rules to be adopted for the administration of certain tuition exemptions awarded to veterans and their families.
