## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the provision of employment assistance and supported
3	employment to certain Medicaid waiver program participants.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 32, Human Resources Code,
6	is amended by adding Section 32.075 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 32.075. EMPLOYMENT ASSISTANCE AND SUPPORTED
8	EMPLOYMENT. (a) In this section:
9	(1) "Employment assistance" means assistance provided
10	to an individual to help the individual locate paid employment in
11	the community. Employment assistance includes:
12	(A) identifying an individual's employment
13	preferences, job skills, and requirements for a work setting and
14	<pre>work conditions;</pre>
15	(B) locating prospective employers offering
16	employment compatible with an individual's identified preferences,
17	skills, and requirements; and
18	(C) contacting a prospective employer on behalf
19	of an individual and negotiating the individual's employment.
20	(2) "Supported employment" means assistance provided,
21	in order to sustain paid employment, to an individual who, because
22	of a disability, requires intensive, ongoing support to be
23	self-employed, work from home, or perform in a work setting at which
24	individuals without disabilities are employed. Supported

- 1 employment includes adaptations, supervision, and training related
- 2 to an individual's diagnosis.
- 3 (b) This section applies only to the following medical
- 4 assistance waiver programs:
- 5 (1) the community based alternatives program;
- 6 (2) the community living assistance and support
- 7 services program;
- 8 <u>(3) the deaf-blind with multiple disabilities</u>
- 9 program;
- 10 (4) the home and community-based services program;
- 11 (5) the medically dependent children program;
- 12 (6) the STAR + PLUS Medicaid managed care program;
- 13 (7) the Texas home living program; and
- 14 (8) the youth empowerment services program.
- 15 (c) The department shall provide employment assistance and
- 16 supported employment to participants in the waiver programs
- 17 <u>identified in Subsection (b).</u>
- 18 SECTION 2. As soon as possible after the effective date of
- 19 this Act, the Health and Human Services Commission shall apply for
- 20 any waiver or other authorization necessary to implement this Act.
- 21 The commission may delay implementing this Act until the waiver or
- 22 authorization is granted.
- 23 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 24 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 25 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 26 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 27 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
