## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

| 4  | BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:  |
| 5  | SECTION 1. Sections 22.035(a), (b), (e), (f), (g), (i),  |
| 6  | (j), (k), and (l), Human Resources Code, are amended to read as                                      |
| 7  | follows:   |
| 8  | (a) A work group to be known as the Children's Policy  |
| 9  | Council shall assist the Department of Aging and Disability  |
| 10 | Services [department], the Health and Human Services Commission                                      |
| 11 | [commissioner of health and human services], the [Texas] Department                                  |
| 12 | of <u>State</u> Health <u>Services</u> , the [ <del>Texas</del> ] Department of <u>Assistive</u> and |
| 13 | Rehabilitative Services [Mental Health and Mental Retardation],                                      |
| 14 | and the Department of <u>Family and</u> Protective [and Regulatory]                                  |
| 15 | Services in developing, implementing, and administering family                                       |
| 16 | support policies for children with disabilities relating to:   |
| 17 | (1) [and related] long-term services and supports;   |
| 18 | (2) health services; and   |
| 19 | (3) mental [care and] health services [programs for  |
| 20 | <pre>children].</pre>  |

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<u>Services Commission</u> [health and human services] shall appoint the

members of the work group, which must include the following:

(b) The <u>executive</u> commissioner of <u>the Health and Human</u>

(1) a person who is younger than 22 years of age and is

- 1 a consumer of long-term care and health programs for children;
- 2 (2) an individual who is younger than 25 years of age
- 3 and who receives or has received mental health services;
- 4 (3) relatives of consumers of long-term care and
- 5 health programs for children;
- (4) (4) (4) a representative from an organization that
- 7 is an advocate for consumers of long-term care and health programs
- 8 for children;
- 9 [(4) a representative from a state agency that
- 10 provides long-term care and health programs for children;
- 11 (5) a person from a private entity that provides
- 12 long-term care and health programs for children;
- 13 (6) a person from a public entity that provides
- 14 long-term care and health programs for children;
- 15 (7) a person with expertise in the availability of
- 16 funding and the application of funding formulas for children's
- 17 long-term care and health services;
- 18 (8) a representative from a faith-based organization;
- 19 (9) a representative from a nonspecialized community
- 20 services organization; and
- 21 (10) a representative from a business that is not
- 22 related to providing services to persons with disabilities.
- 23 (e) The <u>Health and Human Services Commission</u> [department
- 24 and the Texas Department of Health] shall [equally] provide
- 25 administrative support, including staff, to the work group.
- 26 (f) A member of the work group serves at the will of the
- 27 executive commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission

- 1 [health and human services].
- 2 (g) The executive commissioner of the Health and Human
- 3 Services Commission [health and human services] shall appoint a
- 4 member of the work group to serve as a presiding officer.
- 5 (i) A member of the work group receives no additional
- 6 compensation for serving on the work group. Consumers and
- 7 relatives of consumers serving on the work group shall be
- 8 reimbursed for travel and other expenses necessary for
- 9 participation as provided in the General Appropriations Act. Other
- 10 members of the work group may not be reimbursed for travel or other
- 11 expenses incurred while conducting the business of the work group.
- 12 Reimbursement under this subsection shall be paid equally out of
- 13 funds appropriated to the Department of Aging and Disability
- 14 Services [department] and funds appropriated to the [Texas]
- 15 Department of <u>State</u> Health <u>Services</u>.
- 16 (j) The work group <u>may</u> [shall] study and make
- 17 recommendations in the following areas:
- 18 (1) access of a child or a child's family to effective
- 19 case management services, including case management services with a
- 20 single case manager, parent case managers, or independent case
- 21 managers;
- 22 (2) the transition needs of children who reach an age
- 23 at which they are no longer eligible for services at the [Texas]
- 24 Department of State Health Services, the Texas Education Agency,
- 25 and other applicable state agencies;
- 26 (3) the blending of funds, including case management
- 27 funding, for children needing long-term care, [and] health

- 1 services, and mental health services;
- 2 (4) collaboration and coordination of children's
- 3 services between the <u>Department of Aging and Disability Services</u>
- 4 [department], the [Texas] Department of State Health Services, the
- 5 [Texas] Department of Assistive and Rehabilitative Services, the
- 6 Department of Family and Protective Services [Mental Health and
- 7 Mental Retardation], and any other agency determined to be
- 8 applicable by the work group;
- 9 (5) budgeting and the use of funds appropriated for
- 10 children's long-term care services, [and children's] health
- 11 services, and mental health services;
- 12 (6) services and supports for families providing care
- 13 for children with disabilities;
- 14 (7) effective permanency planning for children who
- 15 reside in institutions or who are at risk of placement in an
- 16 institution;
- 17 (8) barriers to enforcement of regulations regarding
- 18 institutions that serve children with disabilities; and
- 19 (9) the provision of services under the medical
- 20 assistance program to children younger than 23 years of age with
- 21 disabilities or special health care needs under a waiver granted
- 22 under Section 1915(c) of the federal Social Security Act (42 U.S.C.
- 23 Section 1396n(c)).
- (k) Not later than September 1 of each even-numbered year,
- 25 the work group shall report on its findings and recommendations to
- 26 the legislature and the executive commissioner of the Health and
- 27 Human Services Commission [health and human services].

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- 1 (1) After evaluating and considering recommendations
- 2 reported under Subsection (k), the <u>executive commissioner of the</u>
- 3 Health and Human Services Commission shall adopt rules to implement
- 4 guidelines for providing long-term care, [and] health services, and
- 5 mental health services to children with disabilities.
- 6 SECTION 2. Section 531.159(f), Government Code, is amended
- 7 to read as follows:
- 8 (f) The commission by rule shall develop procedures by which
- 9 to conduct the reviews required by Subsections (c), (d), and (e).
- 10 In developing the procedures, the commission may [shall] seek input
- 11 from the work group on children's long-term <u>services</u>, [care and]
- 12 health <u>services</u>, and <u>mental health services</u> [<del>programs</del>] established
- 13 under Section 22.035, Human Resources Code.
- 14 SECTION 3. As soon as possible after the effective date of
- 15 this Act, the executive commissioner of the Health and Human
- 16 Services Commission shall appoint three additional members to the
- 17 Children's Policy Council. In appointing members, the executive
- 18 commissioner shall consider appointing members with expertise in
- 19 mental health services.
- 20 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
