- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 51.9192, Education Code, is amended by
- 7 amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsection (d-2) to read as
- 8 follows:
- 9 (b) This section applies only to an entering student at an
- 10 institution of higher education or private or independent
- 11 institution of higher education. This section does not apply to a
- 12 student of an institution who is enrolled only in online or other
- 13 distance education courses or who is 22 [30] years of age or older.
- 14 For purposes of this subsection, "entering student" includes:
- 15 (1) a new student, as defined by Section 51.9191; and
- 16 (2) a student who previously attended an institution
- 17 of higher education or private or independent institution of higher
- 18 education before January 1, 2012, and who is enrolling in the same
- 19 or another institution of higher education or private or
- 20 independent institution of higher education following a break in
- 21 enrollment of at least one fall or spring semester.
- 22 <u>(d-2)</u> An affidavit submitted under Subsection (d)(2) must
- 23 be:
- 24 (1) on a form described by Section 161.0041, Health

- 1 and Safety Code; and
- 2 (2) submitted to the appropriate admitting official
- 3 not later than the 90th day after the date the affidavit is
- 4 notarized.
- 5 SECTION 2. Section 161.0041(a), Health and Safety Code, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 (a) A person claiming an exemption from a required
- 8 immunization based on reasons of conscience, including a religious
- 9 belief, under Section 161.004 of this code, Section 38.001,
- 10 <u>51.9192</u>, or 51.933, Education Code, or Section 42.043, Human
- 11 Resources Code, must complete an affidavit on a form provided by the
- 12 department stating the reason for the exemption.
- SECTION 3. The changes in law made by this Act apply
- 14 beginning with entering students enrolling in public or private or
- 15 independent institutions of higher education in this state on or
- 16 after January 1, 2014.
- 17 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect October 1, 2013.
