## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

2	relating to civil liability for compelled prostitution and certain

4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Title 4, Civil Practice and Remedies Code, is
6	amended by adding Chapter 98A to read as follows:
7	CHAPTER 98A. LIABILITY FOR COMPELLED PROSTITUTION AND CERTAIN
8	PROMOTION OF PROSTITUTION
9	Sec. 98A.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
10	(1) "Advertisement" means any communication that
11	promotes a commercial product or service, including a communication
12	on an Internet website operated for a commercial purpose.
13	(2) "Aggravated promotion of prostitution" means
14	conduct that constitutes an offense under Section 43.04, Penal
15	Code.
16	(3) "Compelled prostitution" means prostitution
17	resulting from compelling prostitution.
18	(4) "Compelling prostitution" means conduct that
19	constitutes an offense under Section 43.05, Penal Code.
20	(5) "Promotion of prostitution" means conduct that
21	constitutes an offense under Section 43.03, Penal Code.
22	(6) "Prostitution" means conduct that constitutes an
23	offense under Section 43.02, Penal Code.
2/1	(7) "Wictim of compelled prostitution" and "wictim"

- 1 mean a person who commits prostitution as a result of another
- 2 person's compelling prostitution.
- 3 Sec. 98A.002. LIABILITY. (a) A defendant is liable to a
- 4 victim of compelled prostitution, as provided by this chapter, for
- 5 damages arising from the compelled prostitution if the defendant:
- 6 (1) engages in compelling prostitution with respect to
- 7 the victim;
- 8 (2) knowingly or intentionally engages in promotion of
- 9 prostitution or aggravated promotion of prostitution that results
- 10 in compelling prostitution with respect to the victim; or
- 11 (3) publishes an advertisement that the defendant
- 12 knows or reasonably should know constitutes promotion of
- 13 prostitution or aggravated promotion of prostitution, and the
- 14 publication of the advertisement results in compelling
- 15 prostitution with respect to the victim.
- 16 (b) It is not a defense to liability under this chapter
- 17 that:
- 18 (1) the defendant:
- 19 (A) has been acquitted or has not been prosecuted
- 20 or convicted under Subchapter A, Chapter 43, Penal Code, or has
- 21 been convicted of a different offense or of a different type or
- 22 class of offense for the conduct that is alleged to give rise to
- 23 <u>liability under this chapter;</u>
- 24 (B) is related to the victim by affinity or
- 25 consanguinity, has been in a consensual sexual relationship with
- 26 the victim, or has resided with the victim in a household; or
- (C) has paid or otherwise compensated the victim

3	(A) voluntarily engaged in prostitution before
4	or after the compelled prostitution occurred; or
5	(B) did not attempt to escape, flee, or otherwise
6	terminate contact with the defendant at the time the compelled

8	Sec. 98A.003. DAMAGES. (a) A claimant who prevails in a
9	suit under this chapter shall be awarded:
10	(1) actual damages, including damages for mental
11	anguish even if an injury other than mental anguish is not shown;
12	(2) court costs; and
13	(3) reasonable attorney's fees.
14	(b) In addition to an award under Subsection (a), a claimant
15	who prevails in a suit under this chapter may recover exemplary
16	damages.
17	Sec. 98A.004. CAUSE OF ACTION CUMULATIVE. The cause of
18	action created by this chapter is cumulative of any other remedy
19	provided by common law or statute.
20	Sec. 98A.005. JOINT AND SEVERAL LIABILITY. A person who
21	engages in conduct described by Section 98A.002 and is found liable
22	under this chapter or other law for any amount of damages arising

- 3 SECTION 2. Chapter 98A, Civil Practice and Remedies Code,
- 4 as added by this Act, applies only to a cause of action that accrues
- 5 on or after the effective date of this Act. A cause of action that
- 6 accrues before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law
- 7 in effect immediately before that date, and that law is continued in
- 8 effect for that purpose.
- 9 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
