A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT relating to a housing plan developed and certain 2 housing 3 information collected and reported by the Texas Department of 4 Housing and Community Affairs. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 5 SECTION 1. Subsection (c), Section 2306.072, Government 6 Code, is amended to read as follows: 7 8 (C) The report must include: (1) a complete operating and financial statement of 9 10 the department; a comprehensive statement of the activities of the 11 (2) 12 department during the preceding year to address the needs 13 identified in the state low income housing plan prepared as required by Section 2306.0721, including: 14 15 (A) a statistical and narrative analysis of the department's performance in addressing the housing needs 16 of individuals and families of low and very low income; 17 (B) the ethnic and racial composition 18 of 19 individuals and families applying for and receiving assistance from each housing-related program operated by the department; [and] 20 (C) the department's progress in meeting the 21 22 goals established in the previous housing plan, including goals established with respect to the populations described by Section 23 24 2306.0721(c)(1); and

1 (D) recommendations on how to improve the 2 coordination of department services to the populations described by 3 Section 2306.0721(c)(1);

4 (3) an explanation of the efforts made by the 5 department to ensure the participation of individuals of low income 6 and their community-based institutions in department programs that 7 affect them;

8 (4) a statement of the evidence that the department 9 has made an affirmative effort to ensure the involvement of 10 individuals of low income and their community-based institutions in 11 the allocation of funds and the planning process;

12 (5) a statistical analysis, delineated according to 13 each ethnic and racial group served by the department, that 14 indicates the progress made by the department in implementing the 15 state low income housing plan in each of the uniform state service 16 regions;

17 (6) an analysis, based on information provided by the fair housing sponsor reports required under Section 2306.0724 and 18 other available data, of fair housing opportunities in each housing 19 development that receives financial assistance from the department 20 includes information for 21 that the following each housing development that contains 20 or more living units: 22

(A) the street address and municipality or county
 in which the property is located;

(B) the telephone number of the property26 management or leasing agent;

(C) the total number of units, reported by

1 bedroom size;

2 (D) the total number of units, reported by 3 bedroom size, designed for individuals who are physically 4 challenged or who have special needs and the number of these 5 individuals served annually;

6 (E) the rent for each type of rental unit,7 reported by bedroom size;

8

(F) the race or ethnic makeup of each project;

9 (G) the number of units occupied by individuals 10 receiving government-supported housing assistance and the type of 11 assistance received;

12 (H) the number of units occupied by individuals 13 and families of extremely low income, very low income, low income, 14 moderate income, and other levels of income;

(I) a statement as to whether the department has been notified of a violation of the fair housing law that has been filed with the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development, the Commission on Human Rights, or the United States Department of Justice; and

20 (J) a statement as to whether the development has any instances of material noncompliance with bond indentures or 21 22 deed restrictions discovered through the normal monitoring and procedures include meeting 23 activities that occupancy 24 requirements or rent restrictions imposed by deed restriction or 25 financing agreements;

(7) a report on the geographic distribution of low
income housing tax credits, the amount of unused low income housing

tax credits, and the amount of low income housing tax credits 1 2 received from the federal pool of unused funds from other states; and 3 4 (8) a statistical analysis, based on information provided by the fair housing sponsor reports required by Section 5 2306.0724 and other available data, of average rents reported by 6 7 county. Subsection (c), Section 2306.0721, Government SECTION 2. 8 9 Code, is amended to read as follows: 10 (C) The plan must include: 11 (1)an estimate and analysis of the size and the different housing needs of the following populations in each 12 uniform state service region: 13 individuals and families of moderate, low, 14 (A) 15 very low, and extremely low income; 16 (B) individuals with special needs; [and] 17 (C) homeless individuals; (D) veterans; 18 (E) farmworkers; 19 20 (F) youth who are aging out of foster care; and (G) elderly individuals; 21 22 a proposal to use all available housing resources (2) to address the housing needs of the populations described by 23 24 Subdivision (1) by establishing funding levels for all 25 housing-related programs; 26 (3) an estimate of the number of federally assisted housing units available for individuals and families of low and 27

very low income and individuals with special needs in each uniform
 state service region;

3 (4) a description of state programs that govern the4 use of all available housing resources;

5 (5) a resource allocation plan that targets all 6 available housing resources to individuals and families of low and 7 very low income and individuals with special needs in each uniform 8 state service region;

9 (6) a description of the department's efforts to 10 monitor and analyze the unused or underused federal resources of 11 other state agencies for housing-related services and services for 12 homeless individuals and the department's recommendations to 13 ensure the full use by the state of all available federal resources 14 for those services in each uniform state service region;

15 (7) strategies to provide housing for individuals and
16 families with special needs in each uniform state service region;

17 (8) a description of the department's efforts to 18 encourage in each uniform state service region the construction of 19 housing units that incorporate energy efficient construction and 20 appliances;

(9) an estimate and analysis of the housing supply in
each uniform state service region;

(10) an inventory of all publicly and, where possible, privately funded housing resources, including public housing authorities, housing finance corporations, community housing development organizations, and community action agencies;

27 (11) strategies for meeting rural housing needs;

(12) a biennial action plan for colonias that:

(A) addresses current policy goals for colonia
programs, strategies to meet the policy goals, and the projected
outcomes with respect to the policy goals; and

5 (B) includes information on the demand for 6 contract-for-deed conversions, services from self-help centers, 7 consumer education, and other colonia resident services in counties 8 some part of which is within 150 miles of the international border 9 of this state;

10 (13) a summary of public comments received at a 11 hearing under this chapter or from another source that concern the 12 demand for colonia resident services described by Subdivision (12); 13 (13-a) information regarding foreclosures of 14 residential property in this state, including the number and 15 geographic location of those foreclosures; and

16 (14) any other housing-related information that the 17 state is required to include in the one-year action plan of the 18 consolidated plan submitted annually to the United States 19 Department of Housing and Urban Development.

20 SECTION 3. Section 51.0022, Property Code, is repealed.

SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
