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S.B. No. 132

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to the contents and applicability of a school district's 3 grading policy.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Section 28.0216, Education Code, is amended to 6 read as follows:

Sec. 28.0216. DISTRICT GRADING POLICY. (a) Before each <u>school year, a</u> [A] school district shall adopt a grading policy, including provisions for the assignment of grades on class assignments and examinations <u>and the calculation of cumulative</u> <u>averages of grades</u>[, before each school year]. A district grading policy:

(1) must require a [classroom] teacher to assign a grade that reflects the student's relative mastery of <u>the subject</u> without employing grade inflation or misrepresenting a student's deserved grade [an assignment];

17 (2) may not require a [classroom] teacher to assign a 18 minimum grade [for an assignment] without regard to the student's 19 quality of work; and

20 (3) may allow a student a reasonable opportunity to 21 make up or redo a class assignment or examination for which the 22 student received a failing grade.

23 (b) A district grading policy shall apply to the assignment 24 of a grade for which written notice is required under Section

1 <u>28.022(a)(2), in addition to any other grade assigned by the</u> 2 <u>district.</u>

3 SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2013-2014 4 school year.

5 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 6 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 7 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 8 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 9 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
