## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to procedures for filing complaints with, and providing
3	notice of certain violations to, the Texas Board of Professional
4	Geoscientists.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Section 1002.201, Occupations Code, is amended
7	to read as follows:
8	Sec. 1002.201. PUBLIC INTEREST INFORMATION. $(a)$ The board
9	shall:
10	(1) prepare information of public interest

- 11 describing:
- 12 (A) the regulatory functions of the board; and
- 13 (B) the board's procedures by which complaints
- 14 are filed with and resolved by the board; and
- 15 (2) make the information available to the public and
- 16 appropriate state agencies.
- 17 (b) The board shall maintain on the board's Internet
- 18 website:
- 19 (1) information regarding the procedure for filing a
- 20 complaint with the board; and
- 21 (2) a means by which a person may electronically file a
- 22 complaint with the board.
- SECTION 2. Section 1002.202, Occupations Code, is amended
- 24 by amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsection (d-1) to read as

- 1 follows:
- 2 (b) A complaint from a member of the public must be:
- 3 (1) in writing;
- 4 (2) sworn to by the person making the complaint; and
- 5 (3) filed with the secretary-treasurer  $\underline{\text{or}}$
- 6 electronically through the board's Internet website.
- 7 (d-1) The board shall accept a complaint regardless of
- 8 whether the complaint is notarized.
- 9 SECTION 3. Subchapter E, Chapter 1002, Occupations Code, is
- 10 amended by adding Sections 1002.206 and 1002.207 to read as
- 11 follows:
- 12 Sec. 1002.206. COMPLAINT EDUCATION. (a) In this section,
- 13 "state agency" has the meaning assigned by Section 57.001.
- 14 (b) The board shall work with each state agency that uses
- 15 the services of a person licensed under this chapter and other
- 16 appropriate state agencies as determined by the board, including a
- 17 state agency with which the board has entered into a memorandum of
- 18 understanding that addresses the coordination of activities or
- 19 complaints, to educate the agency's employees regarding the
- 20 procedures by which complaints are filed with and resolved by the
- 21 board.
- Sec. 1002.207. DUTY OF STATE AGENCY TO REPORT POTENTIAL
- 23 VIOLATION. (a) In this section, "state agency" has the meaning
- 24 assigned by Section 57.001.
- 25 (b) A state agency that becomes aware of a potential
- 26 violation of this chapter or a rule adopted under this chapter shall
- 27 forward any information relating to the potential violation and any

- 1 <u>subsequently obtained information to the board.</u>
- 2 (c) Information forwarded by a state agency under this
- 3 section that is privileged or confidential remains privileged or
- 4 confidential following receipt by the board. The privilege or
- 5 confidentiality extends to any board communication concerning the
- 6 information forwarded, regardless of the form, manner, or content
- 7 of the communication.
- 8 (d) The forwarding of privileged or confidential
- 9 information by a state agency does not waive a privilege in or
- 10 <u>create an exception to the confidentiality of the information.</u>
- 11 (e) A state agency's provision of information or failure to
- 12 provide information under this section does not give rise to a cause
- 13 of action against the agency.
- 14 SECTION 4. Not later than December 1, 2013, the Texas Board
- 15 of Professional Geoscientists shall adopt rules necessary to
- 16 implement Sections 1002.201 and 1002.202, Occupations Code, as
- 17 amended by this Act, and Sections 1002.206 and 1002.207,
- 18 Occupations Code, as added by this Act.
- 19 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
