- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 1001.005, Occupations Code, is amended
- 6 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 1001.005. APPLICATION OF SUNSET ACT. The Texas Board
- 8 of Professional Engineers is subject to Chapter 325, Government
- 9 Code (Texas Sunset Act). Unless continued in existence as provided
- 10 by that chapter, the board is abolished and this chapter expires
- 11 September 1, 2025 [2013].
- 12 SECTION 2. Subsection (a), Section 1001.206, Occupations
- 13 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 14 (a) The fee for a license under this chapter, for the annual
- 15 renewal of that license, and for a reciprocal license under this
- 16 chapter is increased by \$200. The fee increase shall be collected
- 17 at the time of the issuance or renewal of the license.
- SECTION 3. Section 1001.304, Occupations Code, is amended
- 19 by adding Subsection (e) to read as follows:
- 20 <u>(e) The board shall:</u>
- 21 (1) adopt policies and guidelines detailing the
- 22 procedures for the examination process, including examination
- 23 admission, examination administration, and national examination
- 24 requirements; and

- 1 (2) post on the board's Internet website the policies
- 2 that reference the examination procedures of the board or, if
- 3 applicable, the national organization selected by the board to
- 4 administer an examination.
- 5 SECTION 4. Subsection (b), Section 1001.309, Occupations
- 6 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 7 (b) The board shall consider as minimum evidence that an
- 8 applicant is qualified for certification or enrollment as an
- 9 engineer-in-training if the applicant:
- 10 (1) complies with the education and character
- 11 requirements of Section 1001.302; and
- 12 (2) has passed the board's [eight-hour written]
- 13 examination in the fundamentals of engineering.
- SECTION 5. Subchapter G, Chapter 1001, Occupations Code, is
- 15 amended by adding Section 1001.3035 to read as follows:
- 16 Sec. 1001.3035. CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORD INFORMATION
- 17 REQUIREMENT FOR LICENSE ISSUANCE. (a) The board shall require
- 18 that an applicant for a license submit a complete and legible set of
- 19 fingerprints, on a form prescribed by the board, to the board or to
- 20 the Department of Public Safety for the purpose of obtaining
- 21 criminal history record information from the Department of Public
- 22 Safety and the Federal Bureau of Investigation.
- 23 (b) The board may not issue a license to a person who does
- 24 not comply with the requirement of Subsection (a).
- 25 (c) The board shall conduct a criminal history check of each
- 26 applicant for a license using information:
- 27 (1) provided by the individual under this section; and

- 1 (2) made available to the board by the Department of
- 2 Public Safety, the Federal Bureau of Investigation, and any other
- 3 criminal justice agency under Chapter 411, Government Code.
- 4 (d) The board may:
- 5 (1) enter into an agreement with the Department of
- 6 Public Safety to administer a criminal history check required under
- 7 this section; and
- 8 (2) authorize the Department of Public Safety to
- 9 collect from each applicant the costs incurred by the Department of
- 10 Public Safety in conducting the criminal history check.
- 11 SECTION 6. Subchapter H, Chapter 1001, Occupations Code, is
- 12 amended by adding Section 1001.3535 to read as follows:
- 13 Sec. 1001.3535. CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORD INFORMATION
- 14 REQUIREMENT FOR LICENSE RENEWAL. (a) An applicant renewing a
- 15 license issued under this chapter shall submit a complete and
- 16 legible set of fingerprints for purposes of performing a criminal
- 17 history check of the applicant as provided by Section 1001.3035.
- 18 (b) The board may not renew the license of a person who does
- 19 not comply with the requirement of Subsection (a).
- 20 (c) A license holder is not required to submit fingerprints
- 21 under this section for the renewal of the license if the license
- 22 holder has previously submitted fingerprints under:
- 23 (1) Section 1001.3035 for the initial issuance of the
- 24 <u>license; or</u>
- 25 (2) this section as part of a prior license renewal.
- SECTION 7. Subchapter J, Chapter 1001, Occupations Code, is
- 27 amended by adding Section 1001.4528 to read as follows:

- 1 Sec. 1001.4528. EMERGENCY SUSPENSION. (a) The board or a
- 2 three-member panel of board members designated by the board shall
- 3 temporarily suspend the license, certificate, or registration of a
- 4 person if the board or panel determines from the evidence or
- 5 information presented to it that continued practice by the person
- 6 would constitute a continuing and imminent threat to the public
- 7 welfare.
- 8 (b) A license, certificate, or registration may be
- 9 suspended under this section without notice or hearing on the
- 10 complaint if:
- 11 (1) action is taken to initiate proceedings for a
- 12 hearing before the State Office of Administrative Hearings
- 13 simultaneously with the temporary suspension; and
- 14 (2) a hearing is held as soon as practicable under this
- 15 chapter and Chapter 2001, Government Code.
- 16 (c) The State Office of Administrative Hearings shall hold a
- 17 preliminary hearing not later than the 14th day after the date of
- 18 the temporary suspension to determine if there is probable cause to
- 19 believe that a continuing and imminent threat to the public welfare
- 20 still exists. A final hearing on the matter shall be held not later
- 21 than the 61st day after the date of the temporary suspension.
- SECTION 8. Subsection (a), Section 1001.502, Occupations
- 23 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 24 (a) The amount of an administrative penalty may not exceed
- 25 \$5,000 [\$3,000] for each violation. Each day a violation continues
- 26 or occurs is a separate violation for purposes of imposing a
- 27 penalty.

- 1 SECTION 9. Subchapter L, Chapter 1001, Occupations Code, is
- 2 amended by adding Section 1001.5511 to read as follows:
- 3 Sec. 1001.5511. CEASE AND DESIST ORDER. If it appears to
- 4 the board that a person who is not licensed, certified, or
- 5 registered under this chapter is violating this chapter, a rule
- 6 adopted under this chapter, or another state statute or rule
- 7 relating to the practice of engineering, the board, after notice
- 8 and opportunity for a hearing, may issue a cease and desist order
- 9 prohibiting the person from engaging in the activity.
- 10 SECTION 10. (a) Not later than December 1, 2013, the Texas
- 11 Board of Professional Engineers shall adopt rules necessary to
- 12 implement the changes in law made by this Act to Chapter 1001,
- 13 Occupations Code.
- 14 (b) Sections 1001.3035 and 1001.3535, Occupations Code, as
- 15 added by this Act, apply only to an application for a license or
- 16 renewal of a license filed with the Texas Board of Professional
- 17 Engineers on or after January 1, 2014. An application filed before
- 18 that date is governed by the law in effect immediately before the
- 19 effective date of this Act, and the former law is continued in
- 20 effect for that purpose.
- 21 (c) Subsection (a), Section 1001.502, Occupations Code, as
- 22 amended by this Act, applies only to a violation that occurs on or
- 23 after the effective date of this Act. A violation that occurs
- 24 before that date is governed by the law in effect when the violation
- 25 occurred, and the former law is continued in effect for that
- 26 purpose.
- 27 SECTION 11. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
