- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 28.002(r), Education Code, is amended to
- 6 read as follows:
- 7 (r) The [In adopting the essential knowledge and skills for
- 8 the health curriculum under Subsection (a)(2)(B), the] State Board
- 9 of Education by rule shall require a school district or
- 10 open-enrollment charter school to provide to students in middle
- 11 school, junior high school, and high school instruction [adopt
- 12 <u>essential knowledge and skills</u>] that <u>addresses</u> [address] the
- 13 dangers, causes, consequences, signs, symptoms, and treatment of
- 14 binge drinking and alcohol poisoning. The agency shall compile a
- 15 list of evidence-based alcohol awareness programs from which a
- 16 school district or open-enrollment charter school shall choose a
- 17 program to use in the district's or school's middle school, junior
- 18 high school, and high school science [health] curriculum. The
- 19 agency shall make alcohol awareness programs available without
- 20 cost. To the extent possible, the programs shall be accessible
- 21 <u>electronically for school districts and open-enrollment charter</u>
- 22 schools. A high school shall use a program chosen under this
- 23 subsection in a course that satisfies the science curriculum
- 24 requirement for graduation under Section 28.025(b-1)(1)(A). In

- 1 this subsection, "evidence-based alcohol awareness program" means
- 2 a program, practice, or strategy that has been proven to
- 3 effectively prevent or delay alcohol use among students, as
- 4 determined by evaluations that use valid and reliable measures and
- 5 that are published in peer-reviewed journals.
- 6 SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2013-2014
- 7 school year.
- 8 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 9 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 10 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 11 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 12 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
