2	relating to the regulation of crafted precious metal dealers.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Section 1956.051(3), Occupations Code, is
5	amended to read as follows:
6	(3) "Crafted precious metal" means jewelry,
7	silverware, an art object, or another object, made wholly or partly
8	from precious metal, that is selling at less than 105 percent of the
9	<u>scrap value of the object,</u> other than a coin, a bar, <u>or</u> a
10	commemorative medallion[ <del>, or scrap or a broken item selling at five</del>
11	percent or more than the scrap value of the item].
12	SECTION 2. Section 1956.0613, Occupations Code, is amended
13	to read as follows:
14	Sec. 1956.0613. INVESTIGATION BY COMMISSIONER; INSPECTION
15	<u>OF RECORDS</u> . <u>(a)</u> The commissioner shall:
16	(1) monitor the operations of a dealer to ensure
17	compliance with this <u>subchapter</u> [ <del>chapter</del> ]; and
18	(2) receive and investigate complaints against a
19	dealer or a person acting as a dealer.
20	(b) The commissioner or the commissioner's authorized
21	representative may inspect any record, account, paper, book, or
22	correspondence of a person suspected of being in violation of this
23	subchapter, regardless of whether the person is registered as a
24	dealer.

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1 (c) The commissioner or the commissioner's authorized
2 representative may take statements under oath in an investigation
3 of a matter under this subchapter.

4 SECTION 3. Section 1956.063, Occupations Code, is amended 5 by amending Subsections (c) and (d) and adding Subsection (c-1) to 6 read as follows:

7 (c) For each transaction regulated by this subchapter, the
8 dealer shall submit a report on a preprinted and prenumbered form
9 prescribed by the commissioner <u>or in the manner described by</u>
10 <u>Subsection (c-1)</u>. The form must include the following:

11 (1) the date of the transaction;

12 (2) a description of the crafted precious metal13 purchased by the dealer;

14 (3) the name and physical address of the dealer; and
15 (4) the name, physical description, and physical
16 address of the seller or transferor.

17 (c-1) A dealer may submit a list required by Section 18 1956.062(b) in satisfaction of the reporting requirement of this 19 section if the list contains the information described by 20 Subsection (c).

21 (d) The dealer shall retain a copy of the report until the 22 <u>later of:</u>

23 (1) the second anniversary of the date the dealer 24 sells or otherwise disposes of the crafted precious metal purchased 25 by the dealer; or

26 (2) the third anniversary of the date the report is 27 filed.

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SECTION 4. Sections 1956.064(b) and (c), Occupations Code, are amended to read as follows:

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3 (b) A peace officer who has reasonable suspicion to believe 4 that an item of crafted precious metal in the possession of a 5 dealer, or in the possession of another person on behalf of the 6 <u>dealer</u>, is stolen may place the item on hold for a period not to 7 exceed 60 days by issuing to the dealer <u>or other person</u> a written 8 notice that:

9 (1) specifically identifies the item alleged to be 10 stolen and subject to the hold; and

11 (2) informs the dealer <u>or other person</u> of the 12 requirements of Subsection (c).

13 (c) On receiving the notice, the dealer <u>or other person</u> may 14 not melt, deface, alter, or dispose of the identified crafted 15 precious metal until the hold is released in writing by a peace 16 officer of this state or a court order.

17 SECTION 5. Section 1956.063(d), Occupations Code, as 18 amended by this Act, applies to a report filed under Section 19 1956.063, Occupations Code, on or after the effective date of this 20 Act.

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SECTION 6. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.

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
