1 AN ACT 2 relating to the approval requirement for a rental-purchase 3 agreement that includes a loss damage waiver provision. Δ BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Section 92.153, Business & Commerce Code, 5 is amended to read as follows: 6 Sec. 92.153. RESTRICTIONS ON MERCHANT CONCERNING WAIVER. A 7 8 merchant may not: 9 (1) sell a loss damage waiver unless: 10 (A) [the department has approved the form of] the contract containing the waiver complies with this chapter; and 11 12 (B) the consumer agrees to the waiver in writing; 13 or 14 (2) impose or require the purchase of a loss damage 15 waiver as a mandatory charge. SECTION 2. Subdivisions (2) and (4), Section 92.001, and 16 Sections 92.158, 92.159, and 92.160, Business & Commerce Code, are 17 repealed. 18 19 SECTION 3. (a) An administrative proceeding pending on the effective date of this Act that is related to a complaint filed 20 under Section 92.160, Business & Commerce Code, as that section 21 22 existed immediately before the effective date of this Act, is 23 dismissed. An administrative penalty assessed under Chapter 92, 24 (b)

Business & Commerce Code, as that chapter existed immediately 1 before the effective date of this Act, and Chapter 51, Occupations 2 Code, may be collected as provided by Chapter 51, Occupations Code. 3 4 (c) The Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation shall 5 return a prorated portion of the fee paid by a merchant to the department under Section 92.159, Business & Commerce Code, as that 6 7 section existed immediately before the effective date of this Act. SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013. 8
