## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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- 2 relating to the regulation of speech-language pathology and
- 3 audiology.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 401.057, Occupations Code, is amended to
- 6 read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 401.057. HEARING CONSERVATION PROGRAM. This chapter
- 8 does not prevent a person in an industrial setting from engaging in
- 9 hearing testing as a part of a hearing conservation program in
- 10 compliance with federal Occupational Safety and Health
- 11 Administration regulations [if the person is certified by an agency
- 12 acceptable to the Occupational Safety and Health Administration].
- SECTION 2. Section 401.304(a), Occupations Code, is amended
- 14 to read as follows:
- 15 (a) To be eligible for licensing as a speech-language
- 16 pathologist or audiologist, an applicant must:
- 17 (1) if the application is for a license in:
- 18 (A) speech-language pathology, possess at least
- 19 a master's degree with a major in at least one of the areas of
- 20 communicative sciences or disorders from a program accredited by a
- 21 national accrediting organization that is approved by the board and
- 22 recognized by the United States secretary of education under the
- 23 Higher Education Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. Section 1001 et seq.) in an
- 24 accredited or approved college or university; or

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- 1 (B) audiology, possess at least a doctoral degree
- 2 in audiology or a related hearing science from a program accredited
- 3 by a national accrediting organization that is approved by the
- 4 board and recognized by the United States secretary of education
- 5 under the Higher Education Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. Section 1001 et
- 6 seq.) in an accredited or approved college or university;
- 7 (2) submit a transcript from a public or private
- 8 institution of higher learning showing successful completion of
- 9 course work in amounts set by the board in:
- 10 (A) normal development and use of speech,
- 11 language, and hearing;
- 12 (B) evaluation, habilitation, and rehabilitation
- 13 of speech, language, [and] hearing, and swallowing disorders,
- 14 including the use of instruments to measure parameters of
- 15 communication and swallowing; and
- 16 (C) related fields that augment the work of
- 17 clinical practitioners of speech-language pathology and audiology;
- 18 (3) have successfully completed at least 36 semester
- 19 hours in courses that are acceptable toward a graduate degree by the
- 20 college or university in which the courses are taken, at least 24 of
- 21 which must be in the professional area for which the license is
- 22 requested [and at least six of which must be:
- [(A) in audiology if the application is for a
- 24 speech-language pathology license; or
- 25 [(B) in speech-language pathology if the
- 26 application is for an audiology license];
- 27 (4) have completed the minimum number of hours,

- 1 established by the board, of supervised clinical experience with
- 2 persons who present a variety of communication disorders; and
- 3 (5) have completed the full-time supervised
- 4 professional experience, as defined by board rule, in which
- 5 clinical work has been accomplished in the major professional area
- 6 for which the license is being sought.
- 7 SECTION 3. Section 401.306(a), Occupations Code, is amended
- 8 to read as follows:
- 9 (a) [The board shall notify each examinee of the results of
- 10 the examination not later than the 30th day after the date the
- 11 examination is administered. If an examination is graded or
- 12 reviewed by a national or state testing service that does not
- 13 directly notify examinees of the examination results, the board
- 14 shall notify each examinee of the results not later than the 14th
- 15 day after the date the board receives the results from the testing
- 16 service.
- 17 SECTION 4. Subchapter G, Chapter 401, Occupations Code, is
- 18 amended by adding Section 401.315 to read as follows:
- 19 Sec. 401.315. LICENSING FOR MILITARY SPOUSES. (a) In this
- 20 section:
- 21 (1) "Military service member" means a person who is
- 22 currently serving in the armed forces of the United States, in a
- 23 reserve component of the armed forces of the United States,
- 24 including the National Guard, or in the state military service of
- 25 any state.
- 26 (2) "Military spouse" means a person who is married to
- 27 a military service member.

1	(b) The board shall issue a license to a military spouse
2	who:
3	(1) was licensed in good standing as a speech-language
4	pathologist or audiologist in another state as of the date of the
5	application;
6	(2) holds a master's degree in at least one of the
7	areas of communicative sciences or disorders from a program
8	accredited by a national accrediting organization that is:
9	(A) approved by the board; and
10	(B) recognized by the United States secretary of
11	education under the Higher Education Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. Section
12	1001 et seq.); and
13	(3) has not been the subject of a disciplinary action
14	in any jurisdiction in which the applicant is or has been licensed.
15	SECTION 5. Section 401.403(a), Occupations Code, is amended
16	to read as follows:
17	(a) An audiologist may:
18	(1) engage in any act necessary to:
19	(A) evaluate <u>and provide therapy for</u> hearing <u>and</u>
20	<pre>balance function;</pre>
21	(B) train in the use of amplification, including
22	hearing instruments;
23	(C) make earmolds for hearing instruments;
24	(D) fit, dispense, and sell hearing instruments;
25	or
26	(E) manage cerumen;
27	(2) participate in consultation regarding noise

- 1 control and hearing conservation;
- 2 (3) provide evaluations of environment or equipment,
- 3 including calibration of equipment used in testing auditory
- 4 functioning and hearing conservation; and
- 5 (4) perform basic speech and language screening tests
- 6 and procedures consistent with the audiologist's training.
- 7 SECTION 6. Subchapter I, Chapter 401, Occupations Code, is
- 8 amended by adding Section 401.405 to read as follows:
- 9 Sec. 401.405. TELEPRACTICE. (a) In this section,
- 10 "telepractice" means the use of telecommunications technology by a
- 11 license holder for an assessment, intervention, or consultation
- 12 regarding a speech-language pathology or audiology client.
- 13 (b) The board may adopt rules to provide for the practice of
- 14 speech-language pathology or audiology by the use of telepractice
- 15 by a person licensed under this chapter, including rules that
- 16 <u>establish the qualifications and duties of license holders who use</u>
- 17 telepractice.
- 18 SECTION 7. The following sections of the Occupations Code
- 19 are repealed:
- 20 (1) Section 401.309;
- 21 (2) Section 401.314;
- 22 (3) Section 401.355(c); and
- 23 (4) Section 401.401.
- 24 SECTION 8. The State Board of Examiners for Speech-Language
- 25 Pathology and Audiology by rule may establish a procedure to issue
- 26 an audiologist license to a person who submits an application
- 27 before September 1, 2014, and who:

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- 1 (1) has a master's degree in audiology; and
- 2 (2) was licensed as an audiologist in this state
- 3 between September 1, 2007, and September 1, 2011.
- 4 SECTION 9. Section 401.304, Occupations Code, as amended by
- 5 this Act, applies only to an application for a license filed on or
- 6 after January 1, 2015. An application for a license filed before
- 7 January 1, 2015, is governed by the law in effect on the date the
- 8 application was filed, and that law is continued in effect for that
- 9 purpose.
- 10 SECTION 10. The State Board of Examiners for
- 11 Speech-Language Pathology and Audiology shall adopt any rules
- 12 necessary to implement Section 401.304, Occupations Code, as
- 13 amended by this Act, not later than January 1, 2014.
- 14 SECTION 11. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
