## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to commissioners court oversight of certain emergency
3	services districts.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 775, Health and Safety Code, is amended
6	by adding Subchapter K to read as follows:
7	SUBCHAPTER K. DISTRICTS IN CERTAIN COUNTIES
8	Sec. 775.301. DEFINITION. In this subchapter,
9	"commissioners court" means the commissioners court of a county
10	that borders the United Mexican States, has a population of more
11	than 800,000, and appoints a board of emergency services
12	commissioners under this chapter.
13	Sec. 775.302. APPLICABILITY. (a) This subchapter applies
14	only to a district that is located wholly in a county that borders
15	the United Mexican States, that has a population of more than
16	800,000, and for which the commissioners court appoints a board of
17	emergency services commissioners under Section 775.034.
18	(b) This subchapter controls over a provision of this
19	chapter or other law to the extent of a conflict.
20	Sec. 775.303. DELEGATION OR WAIVER BY COMMISSIONERS COURT.
21	(a) The commissioners court may adopt a resolution to:
22	(1) delegate to the board of a district a duty assigned
23	to the commissioners court under this subchapter that relates to
24	that district; or

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1	(2) waive a requirement in this subchapter that the
2	commissioners court approve an action of a district.
3	(b) A resolution adopted under this section may apply to
4	more than one board or district.
5	(c) The commissioners court may by resolution terminate the
6	delegation of a duty or the waiver of an approval requirement.
7	Sec. 775.304. POWERS RELATING TO DISTRICT PROPERTY,
8	FACILITIES, AND EQUIPMENT. (a) The commissioners court may
9	establish policies and procedures the board must comply with when:
10	(1) constructing, purchasing, acquiring, contracting
11	for, leasing, adding to, maintaining, operating, developing,
12	regulating, selling, exchanging, or conveying real or personal
13	property, a property right, equipment, goods, services, a facility,
14	or a system to maintain a building or other facility or to provide a
15	service to or required by the district; or
16	(2) providing services through and using public funds
17	for a volunteer fire department or emergency service provider.
18	(b) The policies and procedures:
19	(1) may include requiring the board to submit to the
20	commissioners court periodic reports on the district's compliance
21	with the policies and procedures;
22	(2) must establish the types of transactions,
23	including maximum dollar amounts, the board may make when
24	conducting an activity described by Subsection (a) without the
25	approval of the commissioners court, if any;
26	(3) must designate by name, title, or position a
27	person in the county as the primary point of contact between the

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1 commissioners court and the board; and

2 <u>(4) may not be established until the commissioners</u> 3 <u>court consults with the board.</u>

(c) This section does not authorize the commissioners court
or the board to use real or personal property, a property right,
equipment, a facility, or a system to provide a telecommunications
service, advanced communications service, or information service
as defined by 47 U.S.C. Section 153, or a video service as defined
by Section 66.002, Utilities Code.

10 <u>Sec. 775.305. BUDGET. (a) The commissioners court shall</u> 11 <u>establish a schedule for a district to prepare an annual budget, tax</u> 12 <u>rate calculations and notices, and a recommended tax rate and to</u> 13 <u>submit the budget, calculations, notices, and recommendation to the</u> 14 <u>commissioners court for final approval.</u>

15 (b) The schedule must take into account requirements of this 16 chapter, Chapter 26, Tax Code, and Section 21, Article VIII, Texas 17 Constitution, applicable to adopting a district tax rate and 18 provide the commissioners court a reasonable amount of time to 19 review the submissions required under Subsection (a).

20 (c) The board shall:

21 (1) prepare an annual budget and submit the budget to
22 the commissioners court for final approval according to the
23 schedule established under this section; and

24 (2) submit to the commissioners court and the county 25 auditor tax rate calculations and notices and a recommended tax 26 rate according to the schedule established under this section.

27 (d) If the commissioners court does not approve or deny a

1 <u>budget submitted to the commissioners court under this section</u> 2 <u>before the 31st day after the date the budget is submitted, the</u> 3 <u>commissioners court is considered to have approved the budget.</u> 4 (e) If the commissioners court does not approve or deny a

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5 tax rate recommended to the commissioners court under this section 6 before the 31st day after the date the recommended tax rate is 7 submitted, the commissioners court is considered to have approved 8 the recommended tax rate and the recommended tax rate is the rate 9 for the year in which the rate is recommended.

Sec. 775.306. BUSINESS PARTICIPATION. The board shall 10 11 encourage and promote participation by all sectors of the business community, including small businesses and businesses owned by 12 13 members of a minority group or by women, in the process by which the district enters into contracts. The board shall develop a plan for 14 the district to identify and remove barriers that do not have a 15 16 definite or objective relationship to quality or competence and that unfairly discriminate against small businesses and businesses 17 owned by members of a minority group or by women. These barriers 18 may include contracting procedures and contract specifications or 19 20 conditions.

21 SECTION 2. (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b) of 22 this section, this Act takes effect September 1, 2013.

(b) Section 775.305, Health and Safety Code, as added bythis Act, takes effect January 1, 2014.

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
