2	relating to the liability of certain social workers who provide
3	volunteer health care services to charitable organizations.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subdivision (5), Section 84.003, Civil Practice
6	and Remedies Code, is amended to read as follows:
7	(5) "Volunteer health care provider" means an
8	individual who voluntarily provides health care services without
9	compensation or expectation of compensation and who is:
10	(A) an individual who is licensed to practice
11	medicine under Subtitle B, Title 3, Occupations Code;
12	(B) a retired physician who is eligible to
13	provide health care services, including a retired physician who is
14	licensed but exempt from paying the required annual registration
15	fee under Section 156.002, Occupations Code;
16	(C) a physician assistant licensed under Chapter
17	204, Occupations Code, or a retired physician assistant who is
18	eligible to provide health care services under the law of this
19	<pre>state;</pre>
20	(D) a registered nurse, including an advanced
21	nurse practitioner, or vocational nurse, licensed under Chapter
22	301, Occupations Code, or a retired vocational nurse or registered
23	nurse, including a retired advanced nurse practitioner, who is
24	eligible to provide health care services under the law of this

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1 state; 2 (E) a pharmacist licensed under Subtitle J, Title 3, Occupations Code, or a retired pharmacist who is eligible to 3 4 provide health care services under the law of this state; 5 a podiatrist licensed under Chapter 202, (F) Occupations Code, or a retired podiatrist who is eligible to 6 7 provide health care services under the law of this state; a dentist licensed under Subtitle D, Title 3, 8 (G) 9 Occupations Code, or a retired dentist who is eligible to provide 10 health care services under the law of this state; 11 (H) a dental hygienist licensed under Subtitle D, Title 3, Occupations Code, or a retired dental hygienist who is 12 13 eligible to provide health care services under the law of this 14 state; 15 (I) an optometrist or therapeutic optometrist 16 licensed under Chapter 351, Occupations Code, or a retired optometrist or therapeutic optometrist who is eligible to provide 17 health care services under the law of this state; 18 a physical therapist or physical therapist 19 (J) assistant licensed under Chapter 453, Occupations Code, or a 20 21 retired physical therapist or physical therapist assistant who is eligible to provide health care services under the law of this 22 23 state; 24 (K) an occupational therapist or occupational 25 therapy assistant licensed under Chapter 454, Occupations Code, or a retired occupational therapist or occupational therapy assistant 26

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who is eligible to provide health care services under the law of

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1 this state; [or]

2 (L) an audiologist, assistant in audiology, 3 speech-language pathologist, or assistant in speech-language 4 pathology licensed under Chapter 401, Occupations Code, or a 5 retired audiologist, assistant in audiology, speech-language 6 pathologist, or assistant in speech-language pathology who is 7 eligible to provide health care services under the laws of this 8 state; or

9 (M) a social worker licensed under Chapter 505, 10 Occupations Code, or a retired social worker who is eligible to 11 engage in the practice of social work under the law of this state.

12 SECTION 2. This Act applies only to a cause of action that 13 accrues on or after the effective date of this Act. A cause of 14 action that accrued before the effective date of this Act is 15 governed by the law applicable to the cause of action immediately 16 before the effective date of this Act, and that law is continued in 17 effect for that purpose.

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SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.

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
