2 relating to the expiration date of hunting and fishing licenses,

3 stamps, permits, or tags.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Section 42.0175(a), Parks and Wildlife Code, is

6 amended to read as follows:

(a) A license issued under this chapter, other than a 7 lifetime resident hunting license or a nonresident five-day special 8 9 hunting license, is valid for one year beginning on the date the license is issued [only during the yearly period for which the 10 license is issued without regard to the date on which a license is 11 acquired. Each yearly period begins on September 1 or on another 12 date set by the commission and extends through August 31 of the next 13 year or another date set by the commission. A license issued under 14 this chapter other than a nonresident five-day special hunting 15 license that is issued before September 1 or another date set by the 16 commission and does not expire until August 31 of the next year or 17 another date set by the commission is valid from the date of 18 issuance through August 31 of the following year or another date set 19 by the commission. The commission by rule may set the amount of a 20 21 license fee for a license issued during a transition period at an amount lower than prescribed in this chapter and provide for a 22

SECTION 18. The changes in law made by this Act apply only
to a license, stamp, permit, or tag issued by the Parks and Wildlife
Department on or after the effective date of this Act. A license,
stamp, permit, or tag issued by the Parks and Wildlife Department
before the effective date of this Act is covered by the law in
effect when the license, stamp, permit, or tag was issued, and the

former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
