15 (9) had the license holder's or applicant's 16 application for a license refused, revoked, or suspended by the 17 proper licensing authority of another state or nation; or

18 (10) in the case of a physical therapist assistant, 19 treated a person other than under the direction of a physical 20 therapist.

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SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.

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
