 1-18 AN ACT

1-19 relating to an exemption for persons who sell certain burglar and
 1-20 fire alarm components from the requirement to be licensed as an air
 1-21 conditioning and refrigeration contractor.

1-22 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-23 SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 1302, Occupations Code, is
 1-24 amended by adding Section 1302.064 to read as follows:

1-25 Sec. 1302.064. TECHNOLOGY INTEGRATION. This chapter does
 1-26 not apply to a person licensed under Chapter 1702 of this code or
 1-27 Chapter 6002, Insurance Code, who sells, designs, or offers to sell
 1-28 or design a product or technology, including a burglar alarm or fire
 1-29 alarm, that is integrated with an air conditioning or refrigeration
 1-30 system if the sale, design, or offer does not include the
 1-31 installation of any part of an air conditioning or refrigeration
 1-32 system by that person.

1-33 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
 1-34 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
 1-35 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
 1-36 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
 1-37 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
