A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the Texas System of Care and the development of local
- 3 mental health systems of care for certain children.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. The heading to Subchapter G-1, Chapter 531,
- 6 Government Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 7 SUBCHAPTER G-1. DEVELOPING LOCAL MENTAL HEALTH [CARE] SYSTEMS OF
- 8 CARE FOR CERTAIN CHILDREN
- 9 SECTION 2. Section 531.251, Government Code, is amended to
- 10 read as follows:
- 11 Sec. 531.251. TEXAS SYSTEM OF CARE [PILOT PROJECT]
- 12 CONSORTIUM[; EXPANSION PLAN]. (a) The commission shall form a
- 13 consortium to <u>have responsibility</u> [<u>develop criteria</u>] for <u>and</u>
- 14 oversight over a state system of care [and implement the expansion
- 15 of the Texas Integrated Funding Initiative pilot project and] to
- 16 develop local mental health <u>systems of</u> care [systems] in
- 17 communities for minors who are receiving residential mental health
- 18 services or inpatient mental health hospitalization or who are at
- 19 risk of being removed from the minor's home and placed in a more
- 20 restrictive environment to receive mental health services,
- 21 <u>including an inpatient mental health hospital, a</u> residential
- 22 treatment facility, or a facility or program operated by the
- 23 Department of Family and Protective Services or an agency that is
- 24 part of the juvenile justice system [placement to receive mental

- 1 health services].
- 2 (a-1) The consortium must include:
- 3 (1) representatives of the [Texas] Department of State
- 4 [Mental] Health Services [and Mental Retardation], Department of
- 5 Family and Protective [and Regulatory] Services, Health and Human
- 6 Services Commission's Medicaid program, Texas Education Agency,
- 7 [Texas Youth Commission,] Texas Juvenile Justice Department
- 8 [Probation Commission], and Texas Correctional Office on Offenders
- 9 with Medical or Mental Impairments;
- 10 (2) one youth or young adult who has a serious
- 11 emotional disturbance and has received mental health services and
- 12 supports; or
- 13 (3) a family member of a youth or young adult described
- 14 by Subdivision (2) [Commission on Alcohol and Drug Abuse and an
- 15 equal number of family advocates].
- 16 <u>(a-2)</u> The consortium may coordinate with the Children's
- 17 Policy Council for the purposes of including the representation
- 18 required by Subsections (a-1)(2) and (3).
- 19 (b) The commission and the consortium shall:
- 20 (1) <u>maintain</u> [<u>develop</u>] a <u>comprehensive plan</u> [<u>model and</u>
- 21 guidelines for the delivery of mental health services and supports
- 22 [support] to a minor and a minor's family using a system of care
- 23 framework [rinitiated before the person's 18th birthday],
- 24 including best practices in the financing, administration,
- 25 governance, and delivery of those services;
- 26 (2) implement strategies [establish a plan] to expand
- 27 the use of system of care practices [Texas Integrated Funding

- 1 Initiative so that the initiative may operate] in the planning and
- 2 <u>delivery of services throughout the state</u> [up to six communities];
- 3 [and]
- 4 (3) identify appropriate <u>local</u>, [sources of] state,
- 5 and federal funding <u>sources</u> to finance <u>infrastructure and</u> mental
- 6 health services <u>needed to support state and local system of care</u>
- 7 efforts; and
- 8 <u>(4) develop an evaluation system to measure outcomes</u>
- 9 of state and local system of care efforts [under the initiative from
- 10 a central fund for expansion communities].
- 11 (b-1) Not later than November 1 of each even-numbered year,
- 12 the consortium shall submit a report to the legislature and the
- 13 Council on Children and Families that contains an evaluation of the
- 14 outcomes of the Texas System of Care and recommendations on
- 15 strengthening state policies and practices that support local
- 16 systems of care, including recommendations relating to:
- 17 (1) methods to increase access to effective and
- 18 coordinated services and supports;
- 19 (2) methods to increase community capacity to
- 20 implement local systems of care through training and technical
- 21 <u>assistance;</u>
- 22 (3) use of cross-system performance and outcome data
- 23 to make informed decisions at individual and system levels; and
- 24 (4) strategies to maximize public and private funding
- 25 at the local, state, and federal levels.
- SECTION 3. Section 531.255(a), Government Code, is amended
- 27 to read as follows:

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- 1 (a) The commission and the [Texas] Department of State
- 2 [Mental] Health <u>Services</u> [and Mental Retardation] jointly shall
- 3 monitor the progress of the [expansion] communities that implement
- 4 a local system of care, including monitoring cost avoidance and the
- 5 net savings that result from implementing a local system of care.
- 6 SECTION 4. Section 531.257, Government Code, is amended to
- 7 read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 531.257. TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE FOR [GRANT] PROJECTS.
- 9 The commission may provide technical assistance to a community that
- 10 implements a local system of care [receives a grant under Section
- 11 531.256].
- 12 SECTION 5. Sections 531.252, 531.253, 531.254, 531.255(b),
- 13 (c), and (d), 531.256, and 531.258, Government Code, are repealed.
- 14 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
