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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the Texas System of Care and the development of local mental health systems of care for certain children. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 5 SECTION 1. The heading to Subchapter G-1, Chapter 531, Government Code, is amended to read as follows: 6 SUBCHAPTER G-1. DEVELOPING LOCAL MENTAL HEALTH [CARE] SYSTEMS OF 7 8 CARE FOR CERTAIN CHILDREN SECTION 2. Section 531.251, Government Code, is amended to 9 10 read as follows: 11 Sec. 531.251. TEXAS SYSTEM OF CARE [PILOT PROJECT] 12 CONSORTIUM[; EXPANSION PLAN]. (a) The commission shall form a consortium to have responsibility [develop criteria] for and 13 oversight over a state system of care [and implement the expansion 14 of the Texas Integrated Funding Initiative pilot project and] to 15 16 develop local mental health systems of care [systems] in communities for minors who are receiving residential mental health 17 services or inpatient mental health hospitalization or who are at 18 19 risk of being removed from the minor's home and placed in a more restrictive environment to receive mental health services, 20 including an inpatient mental health hospital, a residential 21 treatment facility, or a facility or program operated by the 22 23 Department of Family and Protective Services or an agency that is part of the juvenile justice system [placement to receive mental 24

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1 health services]. (a-1) The consortium must include: 2 3 (1) representatives of the [Texas] Department of <u>State</u> [Mental] Health Services [and Mental Retardation], Department of 4 5 Family and Protective [and Regulatory] Services, Health and Human Services Commission's medicaid program, Texas Education Agency, 6 [Texas Youth Commission,] Texas Juvenile Justice Department 7 8 [Probation Commission], and Texas Correctional Office on Offenders with Medical or Mental Impairments; 9 (2) one youth or young adult who has a serious 10 emotional disturbance and has received mental health services and 11 12 supports; or (3) a family member of a youth or young adult described 13 by Subdivision (1) [Commission on Alcohol and Drug Abuse and an 14 15 equal number of family advocates]. (a-2) The consortium may coordinate with the Children's 16 17 Policy Council for the purposes of including the representation required by Subsections (a-1)(2) and (3). 18 The commission and the consortium shall: 19 (b) maintain [develop] a comprehensive plan [model and 20 (1)guidelines] for the delivery of mental health services and supports 21 [support] to a minor and a minor's family using a system of care 22 [, initiated before the person's 18th birthday], 23 framework 24 including best practices in the financing, administration, governance, and delivery of those services; 25 26 (2) implement strategies [establish a plan] to expand the use of system of care practices [Texas Integrated Funding 27

No. 421 1 Initiative so that the initiative may operate] in the planning and delivery of services throughout the state [up to six communities]; 2 3 [and] 4 identify appropriate local, [sources of] state, (3) and federal funding sources to finance infrastructure and mental 5 health services needed to support state and local system of care 6 efforts; and 7 (4) develop an evaluation system to measure outcomes 8 of state and local system of care efforts [under the initiative from 9 10 a central fund for expansion communities]. (b-1) Not later than November 1 of each even-numbered year, 11 12 the consortium shall submit a report to the legislature and the Council on Children and Families that contains an evaluation of the 13 outcomes of the Texas System of Care and recommendations on 14 strengthening state policies and practices that support local 15 systems of care, including recommendations relating to: 16 17 (1) methods to increase access to effective and coordinated services and supports; 18 19 (2) methods to increase community capacity to implement local systems of care through training and technical 20 21 assistance; (3) use of cross-system performance and outcome data 22 to make informed decisions at individual and system levels; and 23 24 (4) strategies to maximize public and private funding at the local, state, and federal levels. 25 26 SECTION 3. Section 531.252, Government Code, is amended to read as follows: 27

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Sec. 531.252. PROPOSALS FOR LOCAL SYSTEM OF CARE GRANTS
 [EXPANSION COMMUNITIES]. (a) The commission by rule may [shall]
 establish a request-for-proposal process to select [expansion]
 communities to implement a local system of care as funding is
 <u>available</u> [participate in the initiative].

6 (b) The commission and the consortium shall develop 7 criteria to evaluate proposals for selecting [<del>expansion</del>] 8 communities [<del>to participate in the expanded initiative</del>]. The 9 criteria must:

10 (1) [reflect the underlying principles of the Texas 11 Integrated Funding Initiative;

12 [(2)] emphasize services that are provided in the 13 community, strengths-based, culturally and linguistically 14 competent, <u>family-driven</u> [family-centered], and <u>youth-guided</u> 15 [seamless];

16 (2) [(3)] identify populations to be served under the 17 proposals;

18 <u>(3)</u> [(4)] establish [for the expansion communities]
19 service outcome goals for the grant communities;

20 <u>(4) require demonstration of the capacity to collect</u>
21 <u>data</u> related to minors who are receiving [residential] mental
22 health services <u>in residential facilities or inpatient mental</u>
23 <u>health hospitals</u> or who are at risk of residential placement to
24 receive mental health services <u>or inpatient mental health</u>
25 <u>hospitalization</u>, including <u>data relating to whether the system of</u>
26 <u>care is</u>:

(A) decreasing incidents of abuse or neglect of

1 the minors; 2 (B) reducing recidivism juvenile rates of 3 offenders; 4 (C) increasing school attendance and progress of 5 the minors; 6 (D) reducing the rate of placement of the minors 7 residential treatment or inpatient mental in health 8 hospitalization; increasing the rate of reunification of the 9 (E) minors with their families; 10 improving the emotional, behavioral, and 11 (F) 12 social adjustment of the minors; and improving the stability of placements of the 13 (G) 14 minors; provide 15 (5) for locations of participating communities in urban, suburban, and rural settings; and 16 17 (6) specify information that must be provided in a proposal for a community, including: 18 information on the costs of the activities 19 (A) 20 proposed; and characteristics 21 (B) the of minors in the community who are in residential care or inpatient mental health 22 hospitals for mental health services or who are at risk of being 23 24 placed in residential care or inpatient mental health hospitals to receive mental health services. 25 26 (c) Populations to be served, as identified under 27 Subsection (b)(2) [(b)(3)], must include youth at risk of

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residential placement, inpatient mental health hospitalization, 1 incarceration, or reincarceration because of severe emotional 2 3 disturbance, including: 4 (1)students in a special education program as a 5 result of emotional disturbance under Subchapter A, Chapter 29, Education Code; and 6 7 (2) youth with a severe emotional disturbance and a 8 co-occurring: 9 (A) substance abuse disorder; or 10 (B) developmental disability. [(d) Outcome criteria established under Subsection (b)(4) 11 must be consistent with outcome measures used in evaluations of 12 individualized children's services projects in other states.] 13 14 SECTION 4. Section 531.255, Government Code, is amended to 15 read as follows: Sec. 531.255. EVALUATION. [(a)] The commission and the 16 17 [Texas] Department of State [Mental] Health Services [and Mental Retardation] jointly shall monitor the progress of the grant 18 [expansion] communities, including monitoring cost avoidance and 19 the net savings that result from implementing a local system of 20 21 care. SECTION 5. Section 531.257, Government Code, is amended to 22 23 read as follows: 24 Sec. 531.257. TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE FOR GRANT PROJECTS. The commission may provide technical assistance to a community that 25 26 receives a grant under Section 531.252 [531.256]. SECTION 6. Sections 531.253, 531.254, 531.255(b), (c), and 27

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(d), 531.256, and 531.258, Government Code, are repealed.
 SECTION 7. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
