- relating to an informed student document for prospective students 2
- of certain public institutions of higher education. 3
- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4
- 5 SECTION 1. The heading to Chapter 51A, Education Code, is
- amended to read as follows:

- CHAPTER 51A. ONLINE INSTITUTION RESUMES AND INFORMED STUDENT 7
- DOCUMENTS FOR INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION 8
- SECTION 2. Sections 9 51A.002, 51A.003, and 51A.004,
- Education Code, are amended to read as follows: 10
- Sec. 51A.002. POWERS AND DUTIES OF COORDINATING BOARD 11
- 12 RELATING TO INSTITUTION RESUMES AND INFORMED STUDENT DOCUMENTS;
- GENERAL REQUIREMENTS [FOR INSTITUTION RESUMES]. 13 (a)
- 14 coordinating board, in consultation with each institution of higher
- education to which this chapter applies, shall develop and maintain 15
- 16 online resumes and informed student documents, if applicable, for
- each of those institutions. 17
- 18 (b) The coordinating board shall:
- request from each institution of higher education 19 (1)
- to which this chapter applies any information the coordinating 20
- board considers necessary for the coordinating board to include 21
- information or calculate data required to be included in the 22
- 23 institution's resume or informed student document;
- 24 (2) establish for each institution of higher education

- 1 to which this chapter applies a list of representative in-state and
- 2 out-of-state peer institutions and maintain that list on the
- 3 coordinating board's Internet website;
- 4 (3) ensure that each of an institution of higher
- 5 education's online resumes and informed student documents, if
- 6 applicable:
- 7 (A) is available to the public on the
- 8 coordinating board's Internet website, in a one-page format if
- 9 possible, and is accessible through a link that appears on the first
- 10 frame of the coordinating board's Internet website home page in a
- 11 font that is larger than the font of the majority of the text on the
- 12 home page;
- 13 (B) uses enhanced, user-friendly search
- 14 capabilities to ensure that the information required to be included
- 15 in the resume or informed student document is easily accessible to
- 16 the persons for whom the resume or informed student document is
- 17 designed; and
- 18 (C) includes a clearly identifiable link to
- 19 information on the coordinating board's Internet website regarding
- 20 the coordinating board's higher education accountability system;
- 21 and
- 22 (4) ensure that the information provided in each
- 23 resume or informed student document is accurate and up to date and
- 24 includes the most recent data available for out-of-state peer
- 25 institutions.
- 26 (c) The coordinating board may modify, as the coordinating
- 27 board considers necessary, national data regarding an

- 1 institution's out-of-state peer institutions to ensure uniformity
- 2 in the comparison of that data to data regarding the institution for
- 3 which the resume or informed student document is created and the
- 4 institution's in-state peer institutions in a resume or informed
- 5 student document under this chapter.
- 6 (d) Except as provided by Section 51A.206(b), the [The]
- 7 coordinating board is not required to include in the resume or
- 8 <u>informed student document</u> any category of information that is
- 9 unavailable to the coordinating board.
- 10 (e) The data relating to student loans, grants, or
- 11 scholarships included by the coordinating board on an institution's
- 12 resume or informed student document under this chapter [subchapter]
- 13 must be the same as that published in regard to the institution by
- 14 the United States Department of Education on its "College
- 15 Navigator" website, or a successor or related website maintained by
- 16 the United States Department of Education.
- 17 Sec. 51A.003. DUTIES OF INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION
- 18 RELATING TO INSTITUTION RESUMES AND INFORMED STUDENT DOCUMENTS.
- 19 Each institution of higher education to which this chapter applies
- 20 shall:
- 21 (1) submit to the coordinating board any information
- 22 requested by the coordinating board as necessary for the
- 23 coordinating board to include information or calculate data
- 24 required to be included in the institution's resumes or informed
- 25 student documents, or both, as applicable; and
- 26 (2) ensure that the first frame of the institution's
- 27 Internet website home page includes, in a font that is larger than

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- 1 the font of the majority of the text on the home page, an accessible
- 2 link to the institution's online resumes or informed student
- 3 documents, or both, as applicable, maintained on the coordinating
- 4 board's Internet website.
- 5 Sec. 51A.004. LINK TO FEDERAL STUDENT FINANCIAL AID
- 6 INFORMATION. An institution may satisfy a requirement of this
- 7 chapter relating to student loan, grant, or scholarship information
- 8 by linking the <u>institution's</u> online resume <u>or informed student</u>
- 9 documents, or both, as applicable [of the institution] to that
- 10 information as it appears on the website known as "College
- 11 Navigator," or a successor or related website, maintained by the
- 12 National Center for Education Statistics of the U.S. Department of
- 13 Education.
- 14 SECTION 3. Chapter 51A, Education Code, is amended by
- 15 adding Subchapter E to read as follows:
- 16 SUBCHAPTER E. INFORMED STUDENT DOCUMENT FOR INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER
- 17 EDUCATION OTHER THAN MEDICAL AND DENTAL UNITS
- Sec. 51A.201. APPLICABILITY OF SUBCHAPTER. This subchapter
- 19 applies to each institution of higher education other than a
- 20 medical and dental unit.
- 21 Sec. 51A.202. INFORMED STUDENT DOCUMENT FOR PROSPECTIVE
- 22 STUDENTS AND THEIR PARENTS. (a) The coordinating board shall
- 23 maintain for each institution to which this subchapter applies an
- 24 informed student document that is designed for use by prospective
- 25 students of the institution and their parents. The document shall
- 26 be made available by the institution to the public, legislators,
- 27 and other interested policy makers in accordance with Subchapter A.

- 1 (b) The informed student document required by this section
- 2 must identify:
- 3 (1) the institutional grouping to which the
- 4 institution is assigned under the coordinating board's higher
- 5 education accountability system; and
- 6 (2) the institution's in-state and out-of-state peer
- 7 institutions.
- 8 (c) Information required to be included in the informed
- 9 student document regarding the institution's in-state or
- 10 out-of-state peer institutions must be listed in the form of the
- 11 average of that information for those institutions unless otherwise
- 12 prescribed by coordinating board rule.
- 13 (d) The informed student document must include the
- 14 information required by this subchapter relating to the institution
- 15 for the most recent state fiscal year for which the information is
- 16 available and compare that information to the same information for
- 17 the state fiscal year preceding the most recent state fiscal year
- 18 for which the information is available and the state fiscal year
- 19 preceding the most recent state fiscal year for which the
- 20 information is available by five years.
- (e) Notwithstanding any other provision of this chapter,
- 22 the coordinating board is not required to include in an
- 23 institution's informed student document any category of
- 24 information not applicable to the institution's institutional
- 25 grouping under the coordinating board's higher education
- 26 accountability system.
- Sec. 51A.203. COST INFORMATION. An informed student

1	document must include under the heading "COSTS":
2	(1) the average annual total academic costs for a
3	resident undergraduate student enrolled in 30 semester credit
4	hours:
5	(A) at the institution; and
6	(B) at the institution's in-state and
7	<pre>out-of-state peer institutions;</pre>
8	(2) the average net annual total academic costs for a
9	resident undergraduate student enrolled in 30 semester credit
10	hours, excluding grants and scholarships:
11	(A) at the institution; and
12	(B) at the institution's in-state and
13	out-of-state peer institutions; and
14	(3) the average amount of student debt of a bachelor's
15	degree-seeking student at graduation:
16	(A) at the institution; and
17	(B) at the institution's in-state and
18	out-of-state peer institutions.
19	Sec. 51A.204. STUDENT SUCCESS INFORMATION. An informed
20	student document must include under the heading "STUDENT SUCCESS":
21	(1) the average Collegiate Learning Assessment (CLA)
22	score of graduating undergraduate students:
23	(A) at the institution; and
24	(B) at the institution's in-state and
25	out-of-state peer institutions;
26	(2) the four-year, five-year, and six-year graduation
27	rates of full-time bachelor's degree-seeking students:

1	(A) at the institution; and
2	(B) at the institution's in-state and
3	out-of-state peer institutions; and
4	(3) the average number of fall and spring semesters of
5	enrollment attempted by a student to obtain a bachelor's degree:
6	(A) at the institution; and
7	(B) at the institution's in-state peer
8	institutions.
9	Sec. 51A.205. ADMISSIONS INFORMATION. An informed student
10	document must include under the heading "ADMISSIONS":
11	(1) the middle 50 percent test score range of
12	first-time undergraduate students at the institution whose SAT
13	scores were in the 25th to 75th percentile of students' scores at
14	that institution;
15	(2) the middle 50 percent test score range of
16	first-time undergraduate students at the institution whose ACT
17	scores were in the 25th to 75th percentile of students' scores at
18	that institution;
19	(3) the percentage of the students who applied for
20	first-time undergraduate admission to the institution who were
21	offered admission to the institution; and
22	(4) the percentage of undergraduate students admitted
23	to the institution who graduated in the top 10 percent of the
24	student's high school graduating class.
25	Sec. 51A.206. INFORMATION REGARDING SUCCESS BY MAJOR. (a)
26	An informed student document must include under the heading
27	"STUDENT SUCCESS BY UNDERGRADUATE MAJOR" and listed alphabetically

1	by undergraduate major:
2	(1) the average Collegiate Learning Assessment (CLA)
3	score of graduating undergraduate students:
4	(A) at the institution;
5	(B) ranked against other university majors; and
6	(C) at the institution's in-state and
7	<pre>out-of-state peer institutions;</pre>
8	(2) the retention rate of first-time, full-time,
9	degree-seeking entering undergraduate students:
10	(A) enrolled in the institution after one
11	academic year and after two academic years; and
12	(B) enrolled in the institution's in-state peer
13	institutions after two academic years;
14	(3) the average starting salary for graduates of
15	undergraduate degree programs:
16	(A) of the institution; and
17	(B) of the institution's in-state and
18	<pre>out-of-state peer institutions;</pre>
19	(4) the unemployment rate for the following graduates
20	of the institution:
21	(A) those who graduated from undergraduate
22	degree programs during one of the three years immediately preceding
23	the year covered by the document;
24	(B) those who graduated from undergraduate
25	degree programs before the time period described by Paragraph (A);
26	and
27	(C) those awarded a graduate degree by the

- 1 <u>institution; and</u>
- 2 (5) the average, median, 25th percentile, and 75th
- 3 percentile earnings for the following graduates of the institution:
- 4 (A) those who graduated from undergraduate
- 5 degree programs during the three-year period preceding the year
- 6 covered by the document;
- 7 (B) those who graduated from undergraduate
- 8 degree programs before the time period described by Paragraph (A);
- 9 and
- 10 <u>(C)</u> those awarded a graduate degree by the
- 11 <u>institution</u>.
- 12 <u>(b) If data required under this section for an institution</u>
- 13 <u>is not available to the coordinating board, the coordinating board</u>
- 14 shall use comparable state or national data, whichever is
- 15 <u>available</u>, more reliable, and most current.
- Sec. 51A.207. STUDENT READING OF DOCUMENT. Each institution
- 17 to which this subchapter applies shall require each applicant for
- 18 admission to the institution or the applicant's legal guardian to
- 19 verify by signature that the applicant has read the institution's
- 20 informed student document in its entirety as a prerequisite to the
- 21 applicant's enrollment in the institution.
- 22 SECTION 4. The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board
- 23 shall create the informed student documents required by Subchapter
- 24 E, Chapter 51A, Education Code, as added by this Act, and provide
- 25 the documents on the board's Internet website not later than
- 26 February 1, 2014.
- 27 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives

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- 1 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 2 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 3 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 4 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
