3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Section 11, Article 49.25, Code of Criminal
5	Procedure, is amended to read as follows:
6	Sec. 11. RECORDS. <u>(a)</u> The medical examiner shall keep
7	full and complete records properly indexed, giving the name if
8	known of every person whose death is investigated, the place where
9	the body was found, the date, the cause and manner of death, and
10	shall issue a death certificate. The full report and detailed
11	findings of the autopsy, if any, shall be a part of the record.
12	Copies of all records shall promptly be delivered to the proper
13	district, county, or criminal district attorney in any case where
14	further investigation is advisable. The records may not be
15	withheld, subject to a discretionary exception under [are subject
16	to required public disclosure in accordance with] Chapter 552,
17	Government Code, except that a photograph or x-ray of a body taken
18	during an autopsy is excepted from required public disclosure in

24 (b) Under the exception to public disclosure provided by

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- 1 Subsection (a), a governmental body as defined by Section 552.003,
- 2 Government Code, may withhold a photograph or x-ray described by
- 3 Subsection (a) without requesting a decision from the attorney
- 4 general under Subchapter G, Chapter 552, Government Code. This
- 5 subsection does not affect the required disclosure of a photograph
- 6 or x-ray under Subsection (a)(1) or (2).
- 7 SECTION 2. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to
- 8 a request for information that is received by a governmental body or
- 9 an officer for public information on or after the effective date of
- 10 this Act. A request for information that was received before the
- 11 effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on the
- 12 date the request was received, and the former law is continued in
- 13 effect for that purpose.
- 14 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
