4	SECTION 1. Subsection (a), Section 552.001, Occupations
5	Code, is amended to read as follows:
6	(a) The Texas State Board of Pharmacy consists of <u>11</u> [nine]
7	members appointed by the governor with the advice and consent of the
8	senate as follows:
9	(1) <u>seven</u> [six] members who are pharmacists; [and]
10	(2) <u>one member who is a pharmacy technician; and</u>
11	(3) three members who represent the public.
12	SECTION 2. Section 552.002, Occupations Code, is amended by
13	adding Subsection (b-1) to read as follows:
14	(b-1) A pharmacy technician board member must, at the time
15	of appointment:
16	(1) be a resident of this state;
17	(2) have been registered as a pharmacy technician for
18	the five years preceding appointment;
19	(3) be in good standing to act as a pharmacy technician
20	in this state; and
21	(4) be acting as a pharmacy technician in this state.
22	SECTION 3. Subsection (a), Section 552.005, Occupations
23	Code, is amended to read as follows:
24	(a) Members of the board are appointed for staggered

six-year terms, with either [. The terms of] three or four members' 1 terms, as applicable, expiring [members expire] every other year at 2 midnight on the last day of the state fiscal year in the last year of 3 4 the member's term. SECTION 4. Subsection (a), Section 552.010, Occupations 5 Code, is amended to read as follows: 6 7 (a) The board shall meet at least[+ [(1)] once every four months to transact board 8 9 business[; and 10 [(2) twice each year for the examination of 11 applicants]. SECTION 5. As soon as practicable after the effective date 12 13 of this Act, the governor shall appoint a pharmacy technician and a pharmacist to the Texas State Board of Pharmacy as required by this 14 15 Act. In appointing the members, the governor shall appoint: 16 (1)a pharmacy technician to a term expiring August 17 31, 2019; and 18 (2) a pharmacist to a term expiring August 31, 2017.

19 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
