A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT relating to passing certain vehicles on a highway; providing a 2 3 penalty. Δ BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Section 545.157, Transportation Code, is amended 5 6 to read as follows: CERTAIN VEHICLES 7 Sec. 545.157. PASSING [AUTHORIZED 8 EMERGENCY VEHICLE]. (a) This section applies only to the following vehicles: 9 10 (1) [On approaching] а stationary authorized emergency vehicle using visual signals that meet the requirements 11 12 of Sections 547.305 and 547.702; 13 (2) $[\tau - \sigma r]$ a stationary tow truck using equipment 14 authorized by Section 547.305(d); and 15 (3) a Texas Department of Transportation vehicle not separated from the roadway by a traffic control channelizing device 16 and using visual signals that comply with the standards and 17 specifications adopted under Section 547.105. 18 19 (b) On approaching a vehicle described by Subsection (a), an operator, unless otherwise directed by a police officer, shall: 20 (1) vacate the lane closest to the [emergency] vehicle 21 22 [or tow truck] when driving on a highway with two or more lanes traveling in the direction of the [emergency] vehicle [or tow 23 24 truck]; or

(2) slow to a speed not to exceed: 1 2 (A) 20 miles per hour less than the posted speed limit when the posted speed limit is 25 miles per hour or more; or 3 4 (B) five miles per hour when the posted speed limit is less than 25 miles per hour. 5 (c) [(b)] A violation of this section is: 6 7 a misdemeanor punishable under Section 542.401; (1) (2) a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of \$500 if the 8 9 violation results in property damage; or a Class B misdemeanor if the violation results in 10 (3) 11 bodily injury. (d) [(c)] If conduct constituting an offense under this 12 section also constitutes an offense under another section of this 13 code or the Penal Code, the actor may be prosecuted under either 14 15 section or under both sections. 16 (e) [(d)] In this section: 17 (1) "Tow[, "tow] truck" means a vehicle that: 18 (A) [(1)] has been issued а permit under Subchapter C, Chapter 2308, Occupations Code; and 19 20 (B) [(2)] is operated by a person licensed under Subchapter D, Chapter 2308, Occupations Code. 21 22 (2) "Traffic control channelizing device" means equipment used to warn and alert drivers of conditions created by 23 work activities in or near the traveled way, to protect workers in a 24 25 temporary traffic control zone, and to guide drivers and pedestrians safely. The term includes a traffic cone, tubular 26 27 marker, vertical panel, drum, barricade, temporary raised island,

1 concrete or cable barrier, guardrail, or channelizer.

2 SECTION 2. Subsection (b), Section 545.301, Transportation
3 Code, is amended to read as follows:

4 (b) This section does not apply to an operator of:

5 (1) a vehicle that is disabled while on the paved or 6 main traveled part of a highway if it is impossible to avoid 7 stopping and temporarily leaving the vehicle on the highway;

8 (2) a vehicle used exclusively to transport solid, 9 semisolid, or liquid waste operated at the time in connection with 10 the removal or transportation of solid, semisolid, or liquid waste 11 from a location adjacent to the highway; or

(3) a tow truck, as defined by Section <u>545.157(e)</u>
[545.157(d)], that is performing towing duties under Chapter 2308,
Occupations Code.
