4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 382, Health and Safety
6	Code, is amended by adding Section 382.069 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 382.069. GREENHOUSE GAS EMISSIONS PERMITTING. (a) In
8	this section, "greenhouse gas" means:
9	(1) carbon dioxide;
10	(2) methane;
11	(3) nitrous oxide; and
12	(4) hydrofluorocarbons, perfluorocarbons, and sulfur
13	hexafluoride.
14	(b) The commission by rule shall adopt a program to allow
15	the commission to assume authority for issuing permits, including
16	preconstruction and federal operating permits, that include the
17	regulation of greenhouse gas emissions in accordance with federal
18	law.
19	(c) As part of the program under Subsection (b), the
20	commission shall develop measures to streamline the authorization
21	process for permits, such as the use of general permits, standard
22	permits, and presumptive best available control technology, that
23	the commission determines are warranted for certain greenhouse gas
24	emissions source categories.

No. 536 1 (d) If it is determined that greenhouse gas emissions are no longer required to be regulated under federal law, on the effective 2 date of the determination: 3 4 (1) the commission shall immediately cease: 5 (A) issuing and requiring permits that include regulation of greenhouse gas emissions; and 6 7 (B) enforcing permit provisions regulating 8 greenhouse gas emissions; (2) a person subject to permit provisions regulating 9 10 greenhouse gas emissions is no longer required to comply with those provisions; and 11 (3) rules adopted by the commission to regulate 12 greenhouse gas emissions are invalid. 13 SECTION 2. (a) 14 The Texas Commission on Environmental 15 Quality shall adopt the program required by Section 382.069, Health and Safety Code, as added by this Act, as soon as possible after the 16 17 effective date of this Act. The adoption of a program under Section 382.069, Health 18 (b) 19 and Safety Code, as added by this Act, does not affect the validity of a permit regulating greenhouse gas emissions issued by the 20 21 United States Environmental Protection Agency: 22 (1) before the effective date of the program; or on or after the effective date of the program if 23 (2) 24 the application for the permit was filed with that agency before the effective date of the program. 25 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 26 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 27
