1-19 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
 1-20 AN ACT

1-21 relating to the peace officers authorized to operate an authorized
 1-22 emergency service vehicle used to conduct a police escort.

1-23 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-24 SECTION 1. Subsection (a), Section 546.002, Transportation
 1-25 Code, is amended to read as follows:

1-26 (a) In this section, "police escort" means facilitating the
 1-27 movement of a funeral, oversized or hazardous load, or other
 1-28 traffic disruption for public safety purposes by a peace officer
 1-29 described by Articles 2.12(1)-(4), (8), (12), and (22), Code of
 1-30 Criminal Procedure.

1-31 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
 1-32 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
 1-33 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
 1-34 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
 1-35 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
