S.B. No. 560

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT
2 relating to authorization for biweekly installment payments for the
3 compensation of certain justices, judges, and district attorneys.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Subsection (c), Section 25.0005, Government
6 Code, is amended to read as follows:

7 (c) The salary shall be paid in:

8 (1) equal monthly installments; or

9 (2) equal biweekly installments if authorized by the
10 commissioners court.

11 SECTION 2. Section 31.004, Government Code, is amended to
12 read as follows:

13 Sec. 31.004. EQUAL [~~MONTHLY~~] INSTALLMENTS. The
14 compensation authorized by this chapter shall be paid in:

15 (1) equal monthly installments; or

16 (2) equal biweekly installments if authorized by the
17 commissioners courts in the counties of the court of appeals
18 district.

19 SECTION 3. Subsection (b), Section 32.001, Government Code,
20 is amended to read as follows:

21 (b) The compensation shall be paid [~~in monthly~~
22 ~~installments~~] from the county general fund or other available funds
23 of the county in:

24 (1) monthly installments; or

1 (2) biweekly installments if authorized by the
2 commissioners court.

3 SECTION 4. Subsection (e), Section 43.180, Government Code,
4 is amended to read as follows:

5 (e) The Commissioners Court of Harris County shall pay the
6 district attorney a salary of not less than \$35,000 a year. The
7 county salary shall be paid in equal biweekly [~~monthly~~]
8 installments.

9 SECTION 5. Subsection (e), Section 152.904, Local
10 Government Code, is amended to read as follows:

11 (e) The Commissioners Court of Harris County shall set the
12 annual salary of the county judge at an amount that is not less than
13 \$1,000 more than the total annual salary received by county
14 criminal court at law judges in the county. The salary shall be
15 paid in [~~12~~] equal biweekly [~~monthly~~] installments.

16 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
