3 SECTION 4. Section 43.180(e), Government Code, is amended 4 to read as follows:

5 (e) The Commissioners Court of Harris County shall pay the 6 district attorney a salary of not less than \$35,000 a year. The 7 county salary shall be paid in equal <u>biweekly</u> [monthly] 8 installments.

9 SECTION 5. Section 152.904(e), Local Government Code, is 10 amended to read as follows:

(e) The Commissioners Court of Harris County shall set the annual salary of the county judge at an amount that is not less than \$1,000 more than the total annual salary received by county criminal court at law judges in the county. The salary shall be paid in [<del>12</del>] equal <u>biweekly</u> [monthly] installments.
