		AN ACT
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- 2 relating to the exemption from sales and use taxes of certain health
- 3 care supplies.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 151.313, Tax Code, is amended by
- 6 amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsections (e) and (f) to read
- 7 as follows:
- 8 (a) The following items are exempted from the taxes imposed
- 9 by this chapter:
- 10 (1) a drug or medicine, other than insulin, if
- 11 prescribed or dispensed for a human or animal by a licensed
- 12 practitioner of the healing arts;
- 13 (2) insulin;
- 14 (3) a drug or medicine that is required to be labeled
- 15 with a "Drug Facts" panel in accordance with regulations of the
- 16 federal Food and Drug Administration, without regard to whether it
- 17 is prescribed or dispensed by a licensed practitioner of the
- 18 healing arts;
- 19 (4) a hypodermic syringe or needle;
- 20 (5) a brace; hearing aid or audio loop; orthopedic,
- 21 dental, or prosthetic device; ileostomy, colostomy, or ileal
- 22 bladder appliance; or supplies or replacement parts for the listed
- 23 items;
- 24 (6) a therapeutic appliance, device, and any related

- 1 supplies specifically designed for those products, if dispensed or
- 2 prescribed by a licensed practitioner of the healing arts, when
- 3 those items are purchased and used by an individual for whom the
- 4 items listed in this subdivision were dispensed or prescribed;
- 5 (7) corrective lens and necessary and related
- 6 supplies, if dispensed or prescribed by an ophthalmologist or
- 7 optometrist;
- 8 (8) specialized printing or signalling equipment used
- 9 by the deaf for the purpose of enabling the deaf to communicate
- 10 through the use of an ordinary telephone and all materials, paper,
- 11 and printing ribbons used in that equipment;
- 12 (9) a braille wristwatch, braille writer, braille
- 13 paper and braille electronic equipment that connects to computer
- 14 equipment, and the necessary adaptive devices and adaptive computer
- 15 software;
- 16 (10) each of the following items if purchased for use
- 17 by the blind to enable them to function more independently: a slate
- 18 and stylus, print enlarger, light probe, magnifier, white cane,
- 19 talking clock, large print terminal, talking terminal, or harness
- 20 for guide dog;
- 21 (11) hospital beds, including mattresses;
- 22 (12) blood glucose monitoring test strips;
- 23 (13) an adjustable eating utensil used to facilitate
- 24 independent eating if purchased for use by a person, including a
- 25 person who is elderly or physically disabled, has had a stroke, or
- 26 is a burn victim, who does not have full use or control of the
- 27 person's hands or arms;

- 1 (14) subject to Subsection (d), a dietary supplement;
- 2 and
- 3 (15) intravenous systems, supplies, and replacement
- 4 parts <u>designed or intended to be</u> used in the <u>diagnosis or</u> treatment
- 5 of humans.
- 6 (e) For purposes of this section, a product is an
- 7 intravenous system if the product is designed or intended to be used
- 8 to administer fluids, electrolytes, blood and blood products, or
- 9 drugs to patients, or to withdraw tissue samples, blood, or fluids
- 10 from patients, without regard to whether the product is designed or
- 11 intended to be inserted subcutaneously or into a vein, artery,
- 12 cavity, muscle, organ, or other part of the body. The term includes
- 13 access ports, adapters, bags and bottles, cannulae, cassettes,
- 14 catheters, clamps, connectors, drip chambers, extension sets,
- 15 filters, in-line ports, luer locks, needles, poles, pumps and
- 16 batteries, spikes, tubing, valves, volumetric chambers, and items
- 17 <u>designed or intended to connect qualifying products to one another</u>
- 18 or to secure qualifying products to a patient.
- 19 (f) In this section, "hospital bed" means a bed specially
- 20 designed for patients with special features for the comfort and
- 21 well-being of the patient and for the convenience of health care
- 22 workers and includes any devices built into the bed or designed for
- 23 <u>use with the bed. A hospital bed may have, but is not required to</u>
- 24 have, wheels, adjustable height for the entire bed, the head, and
- 25 the feet, adjustable side rails, and electronic buttons to operate
- 26 both the bed and other nearby electronic devices. The term includes
- 27 infant warmers, incubators, other beds for neonatal and pediatric

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- 1 patients, and beds specifically designed and marketed for use for
- 2 the rest, recuperation, and treatment of obese patients, obstetric
- 3 patients, and burn patients. The term "hospital bed" does not
- 4 <u>include stretchers</u>, gurneys, or delivery tables.
- 5 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act is a
- 6 clarification of existing law and does not imply that existing law
- 7 may be construed as inconsistent with the law as amended by this
- 8 Act.
- 9 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
