REPAYMENT OF CERTAIN SPEECH-LANGUAGE PATHOLOGIST AND AUDIOLOGIST EDUCATION LOANS 10 Sec. 61.9811. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter: 11 12 (1) "Audiologist" means a person licensed as an audiologist under Chapter 401, Occupations Code. 13 14 (2) "Communicative disorders program" means: (A) a graduate degree program in audiology or 15 16 speech-language pathology accredited by the Council on Academic Accreditation in Audiology and Speech-Language Pathology; or 17 18 (B) an undergraduate degree program that 19 prepares and qualifies students for admission to a graduate degree program described by Paragraph (A). 20 (3) "Public school" <u>means a public preschool or</u> 21 22 primary or secondary school in this state. 23 (4) "Speech-language pathologist" means a person 24 licensed as a speech-language pathologist under Chapter 401,

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1 Occupations Code. 2 Sec. 61.9812. REPAYMENT ASSISTANCE AUTHORIZED. The board 3 shall provide, in accordance with this subchapter and board rules, assistance in the repayment of student loans for speech-language 4 5 pathologists and audiologists who apply and qualify for assistance. 6 Sec. 61.9813. ELIGIBILITY. (a) To be eligible to receive 7 repayment assistance, a speech-language pathologist or an 8 audiologist must: 9 (1) apply to the board; and 10 (2) at the time the speech-language pathologist or audiologist applies for the assistance: 11 12 (A) have been employed as a speech-language pathologist or as an audiologist, as applicable, for at least one 13 year by, and be currently employed full-time in that capacity by, a 14 15 public school; or 16 (B) have been employed as a faculty member of a 17 communicative disorders program at an institution of higher education or private or independent institution of higher education 18 19 for at least one year, and be currently employed full-time in that capacity at such an institution. 20 21 (b) The board by rule may provide for repayment assistance on a pro rata basis for speech-language pathologists and 22 audiologists employed part-time by a public school or institution 23 24 of higher education. Sec. 61.9814. LIMITATION. (a) On qualifying for the 25 26 assistance, a speech-language pathologist or an audiologist may 27 receive repayment assistance grants for each year of employment,

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1	not to exceed five years, by:
2	(1) a public school; or
3	(2) a communicative disorders program at an

6	(b) For each applicable year of employment described by
7	Subsection (a), the total amount of repayment assistance grants
8	received by a speech-language pathologist or an audiologist under
9	this subchapter may not exceed:
10	(1) \$6,000 for an eligible recipient who holds a
11	master's degree but not a doctoral degree; or
12	(2) \$9,000 for an eligible recipient who holds a
13	doctoral degree.
14	Sec. 61.9815. ELIGIBLE LOANS. The board may provide
15	repayment assistance for the repayment of any student loan for
16	graduate-level education at any public or private institution of
17	higher education in or outside of this state received by an eligible
18	speech-language pathologist or audiologist through any lender.
19	Sec. 61.9816. REPAYMENT. (a) The board shall deliver any
20	repayment made under this subchapter in a lump sum payable to:
21	(1) the lender and the speech-language pathologist or
22	audiologist, in accordance with any applicable federal law; or
23	(2) the lender or other holder of the loan on behalf of
24	the speech-language pathologist or audiologist.
25	(b) A repayment made under this subchapter may be applied to
26	the principal amount and accrued interest of the loan.
27	Sec. 61.9817. ADVISORY COMMITTEES. The board may appoint

1	advisory committees to assist the board in administering this
2	subchapter.
3	Sec. 61.9818. PROGRAM FUNDING. (a) The program is funded
4	only from appropriations made specifically to fund the program and
5	from gifts and grants. The board shall attempt to provide repayment
6	assistance in each state fiscal biennium in amounts sufficient to
7	use all amounts appropriated for the program in that biennium.
8	(b) The board may solicit and accept gifts and grants for
9	the purposes of this subchapter.
10	Sec. 61.9819. RULES. (a) The board shall adopt rules
11	necessary for the administration of this subchapter.
12	(b) The board shall distribute a copy of the rules adopted
13	under this section and pertinent information regarding this
14	subchapter to:
15	(1) each appropriate institution of higher education
16	or private or independent institution of higher education;
17	(2) any appropriate state agency; and
18	(3) any appropriate professional association.
19	SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
