Subchapter C, Chapter 61, Education Code, is 5 amended by adding Section 61.0763 to read as follows: 6 Sec. 61.0763. STUDENT LOAN DEFAULT PREVENTION AND FINANCIAL 7 AID LITERACY PILOT PROGRAM. (a) In this section, "career school or 8 9 college" has the meaning assigned by Section 132.001. (b) Not later than January 1, 2014, the board shall 10 establish and administer a pilot program at selected postsecondary 11 12 educational institutions to ensure that students of those institutions are informed consumers with regard to all aspects of 13 14 student financial aid, including: (1) the consequences of borrowing to finance a 15 16 student's postsecondary education; 17 (2) the financial consequences of a student's academic and career choices; and 18 19 (3) strategies for avoiding student loan delinquency and default. 20 21 (c) The board shall select at least one institution from each of the following categories of postsecondary educational 22 23 institutions to participate in the program: 24 (1) institutions of higher education;

2	education; and
3	(3) career schools or colleges.
4	(d) In selecting postsecondary educational institutions to
5	participate in the pilot program, the board shall give priority to
6	institutions that have:
7	<u>(1) a student loan default rate of more than 20</u>
8	percent; or
9	(2) a negative trend in the institution's three-year
10	student loan default rate as compared to the institution's cohort
11	default rates reported by the United States Department of
12	Education.
13	(e) The board shall adopt rules for the administration of
14	the pilot program, including rules governing the selection of
15	postsecondary educational institutions to participate in the pilot
16	program consistent with the requirements of Subsection (d).
17	(f) The board may contract with one or more entities to
18	administer the pilot program according to criteria established by
19	board rule.
20	(g) Not later than January 1 of each year, beginning in
21	2016, the board shall submit a report to the governor, the
22	lieutenant governor, and the speaker of the house of
23	representatives regarding the outcomes of the pilot program, as
24	reflected in the federal student loan default rates reported for
25	the participating institutions.
26	(h) This section expires December 31, 2020.

27 SECTION 2. The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board

1 shall adopt rules for the administration of Section 61.0763, 2 Education Code, as added by this Act, as soon as practicable after 3 this Act takes effect. For that purpose, the coordinating board may 4 adopt the initial rules in the manner provided by law for emergency 5 rules.

6 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 7 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 8 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 9 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 10 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
