- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 32, Human Resources Code,
- 7 is amended by adding Section 32.0426 to read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 32.0426. REIMBURSEMENT FOR SERVICES PROVIDED BY
- 9 ADVANCED PRACTICE NURSES AND PHYSICIAN ASSISTANTS. (a) In this
- 10 section:
- 11 (1) "Advanced practice nurse" has the meaning assigned
- 12 by Section 301.152, Occupations Code.
- 13 (2) "National provider identifier" means the national
- 14 provider identifier required under Section 1128J(e), Social
- 15 Security Act (42 U.S.C. Section 1320a-7k(e)).
- 16 (3) "Physician assistant" means a person who holds a
- 17 license issued under Chapter 204, Occupations Code.
- 18 (b) If an advanced practice nurse or a physician assistant
- 19 provides a service to a recipient under the medical assistance
- 20 program at the direction or under the supervision of another
- 21 provider and the advanced practice nurse or physician assistant, as
- 22 <u>applicable</u>, is the primary provider of the service:
- 23 (1) the name and associated national provider
- 24 identifier of the advanced practice nurse or physician assistant,

- 1 as applicable, must be included as the rendering provider on any
- 2 claim for reimbursement submitted by a provider; and
- 3 (2) the department may reimburse the claim only at the
- 4 provider level established by rule for an advanced practice nurse
- 5 or physician assistant, as applicable.
- 6 (c) The executive commissioner of the Health and Human
- 7 Services Commission may adopt rules necessary to implement this
- 8 section.
- 9 SECTION 2. If before implementing any provision of this Act
- 10 a state agency determines that a waiver or authorization from a
- 11 federal agency is necessary for implementation of that provision,
- 12 the agency affected by the provision shall request the waiver or
- 13 authorization and may delay implementing that provision until the
- 14 waiver or authorization is granted.
- 15 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
