A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT 2 relating to a physical assessment of students by a public school. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: Δ SECTION 1. Subsection (k), Section 28.004, Education Code, is amended to read as follows: 5 6 (k) A school district shall publish in the student handbook and post on the district's Internet website, if the district has an 7 Internet website: 8 (1) a statement of the policies adopted to ensure that 9 10 elementary school, middle school, and junior high school students engage in at least the amount and level of physical activity 11 12 required by Section 28.002(1); 13 (2) a statement of: 14 (A) the number of times during the preceding year 15 the district's school health advisory council has met; whether the district has adopted and enforces 16 (B) 17 policies to ensure that district campuses comply with agency vending machine and food service guidelines for restricting student 18 access to vending machines; and 19 (C) whether the district has adopted and enforces 20 policies and procedures that prescribe penalties for the use of 21 tobacco products by students and others on school campuses or at 22 school-sponsored or school-related activities; and 23 24 (3) a statement providing notice to parents that they

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can request in writing their child's physical fitness assessment
 results at the end of <u>any</u> [the] school year <u>in which their child is</u>
 <u>assessed under Subchapter C, Chapter 38</u>.

4 SECTION 2. Subsection (a), Section 38.101, Education Code, 5 is amended to read as follows:

(a) Except as provided by Subsection (b), a school district
[annually] shall assess the physical fitness of <u>the following</u>
8 students [enrolled in grade three or higher] in a course that
9 satisfies the curriculum requirements for physical education under
10 Section 28.002(a)(2)(C):

11 (1) students enrolled in grades three and five; 12 (2) students enrolled in grade six, seven, or eight, 13 with the grade level assessed to be determined by the district; and 14 (3) students enrolled in grade 9, 10, 11, or 12, with 15 the grade level assessed to be determined by the district.

SECTION 3. This Act applies beginning with the 2013-2014 school year.

18 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 19 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 20 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 21 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 22 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.

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
