- 5 SECTION 1. Chapter 544, Insurance Code, is amended by 6 adding Subchapter L to read as follows:

7 SUBCHAPTER L. CONSUMER INQUIRY

- Sec. 544.551. DEFINITION. In this subchapter, "consumer 8
- inquiry" has the meaning assigned by Section 551.113 for "customer 9
- 10 inquiry."

- Sec. 544.552. APPLICABILITY. This subchapter applies only 11
- 12 to a standard fire, homeowners, or farm and ranch owners insurance
- 13 policy.
- Sec. 544.553. PROHIBITION OF UNDERWRITING AND RATING 14
- DECISIONS BASED ON CONSUMER INQUIRY. An insurer may not: 15
- (1) use an underwriting guideline based solely on 16
- 17 whether a consumer inquiry has been made by or on behalf of the
- applicant or insured; or 18
- 19 (2) charge a rate that is different from the rate
- charged to other individuals for the same coverage or increase a 20
- rate charged to an insured based solely on whether a consumer 21
- 22 inquiry has been made by or on behalf of the applicant or insured.
- 23 SECTION 2. The heading to Section 551.113, Insurance Code,
- 24 is amended to read as follows:

- 1 Sec. 551.113. DECLINATION, NONRENEWAL, OR CANCELLATION
- 2 PROHIBITED; CONSIDERATION OF CONSUMER INQUIRY [CERTAIN CLAIMS].
- 3 SECTION 3. Section 551.113, Insurance Code, is amended by
- 4 adding Subsection (b-1) to read as follows:
- 5 (b-1) An insurer may not consider a customer inquiry as a
- 6 basis for nonrenewal or cancellation of an insurance policy.
- 7 SECTION 4. This Act applies only to an insurance policy that
- 8 is delivered, issued for delivery, or renewed on or after the
- 9 effective date of this Act. A policy delivered, issued for
- 10 delivery, or renewed before the effective date of this Act is
- 11 governed by the law as it existed immediately before the effective
- 12 date of this Act, and that law is continued in effect for that
- 13 purpose.
- 14 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
