- 1 evaluation required under Subsection (b)(3) and the department's

- 3 program. The department shall submit electronically a copy of the

- 6 (d) This section expires September 1, 2017.
- 7 SECTION 2. Not later than May 1, 2014, the Department of
- 8 Family and Protective Services shall establish the pilot program
- 9 required under Section 264.124, Family Code, as added by this Act.
- 10 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
