## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subsections (b) and (d), Section 2165.005,
- 6 Government Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 7 (b) <u>Subject to Section 2204.752</u>, the [The] commission shall
- 8 submit names proposed for a new state building to be used as a state
- 9 or regional headquarters by a state agency, or proposals to rename
- 10 an existing state building which is used as a state or regional
- 11 headquarters by a state agency, to the presiding officers of the
- 12 house of representatives and the senate.
- (d) <u>Subject to Section 2204.752, the</u> [The] commission shall
- 14 submit names proposed for a state building which will be used as a
- 15 local headquarters by a state agency to the presiding officers of
- 16 the house of representatives and the senate and the members of each
- 17 body in whose district the building is located.
- 18 SECTION 2. The heading to Chapter 2204, Government Code, is
- 19 amended to read as follows:

- SECTION 3. Chapter 2204, Government Code, is amended by

## 1 SUBCHAPTER I. NAMING OF PUBLIC PROPERTY

- 2 Sec. 2204.751. DEFINITION. In this subchapter, "public
- 3 property" means real property, including a road, building, or other
- 4 improvement to real property, owned by this state or a political
- 5 subdivision of this state.
- 6 Sec. 2204.752. PROHIBITED PRACTICE. Subject to Section
- 7 2204.753, public property, or any part of public property, may not
- 8 be named after an elected official or a former elected official
- 9 before the fifth anniversary of the date the elected official or
- 10 former elected official last held elective office.
- Sec. 2204.753. EXCLUDED PUBLIC SERVANTS. This subchapter
- 12 does not apply to elected officials who serve in an elective office
- 13 for at least 40 years.
- 14 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 15 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 16 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 17 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 18 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
