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- 2 relating to a prohibition against naming public property after
- 3 certain former elected officials.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Sections 2165.005(b) and (d), Government Code,
- 6 are amended to read as follows:
- 7 (b) <u>Subject to Section 2204.752</u>, the [The] commission shall
- 8 submit names proposed for a new state building to be used as a state
- 9 or regional headquarters by a state agency, or proposals to rename
- 10 an existing state building which is used as a state or regional
- 11 headquarters by a state agency, to the presiding officers of the
- 12 house of representatives and the senate.
- (d) <u>Subject to Section 2204.752, the</u> [The] commission shall
- 14 submit names proposed for a state building which will be used as a
- 15 local headquarters by a state agency to the presiding officers of
- 16 the house of representatives and the senate and the members of each
- 17 body in whose district the building is located.
- SECTION 2. The heading to Chapter 2204, Government Code, is
- 19 amended to read as follows:
- 20 CHAPTER 2204. ACQUISITION AND NAMING OF LAND OR PROPERTY FOR PUBLIC
- 21 PURPOSE [STATE AND FEDERAL PURPOSES]
- SECTION 3. Chapter 2204, Government Code, is amended by
- 23 adding Subchapter I to read as follows:

SUBCHAPTER I. NAMING OF PUBLIC PROPERTY

- 2 Sec. 2204.751. DEFINITION. In this subchapter, "public
- 3 property" means real property, including a road, building, or other
- 4 improvement to real property, owned by this state or a political
- 5 subdivision of this state.
- 6 Sec. 2204.752. PROHIBITED PRACTICE. Notwithstanding any
- 7 other law, public property, or any part of public property, may not
- 8 be named after a former elected official before the fifth
- 9 anniversary of the date the former elected official last held
- 10 <u>elective office.</u>

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- 11 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 12 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 13 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 14 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 15 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
